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Goals of the Pharmacy Merger

- Establish a statewide pharmacy education program with residential instruction in Columbia and Charleston and with potential expansion to Greenville
- Establish a statewide distance education program in order to bring pharmacy education to those individuals who need continuing education courses
- Increase the number of pharmacists who graduate in South Carolina
- Enhance the academic reputation of pharmacy education in South Carolina so that the merged college will be nationally recognized for the innovation of its curriculum
- Enhance the quality and quantity of externally funded research

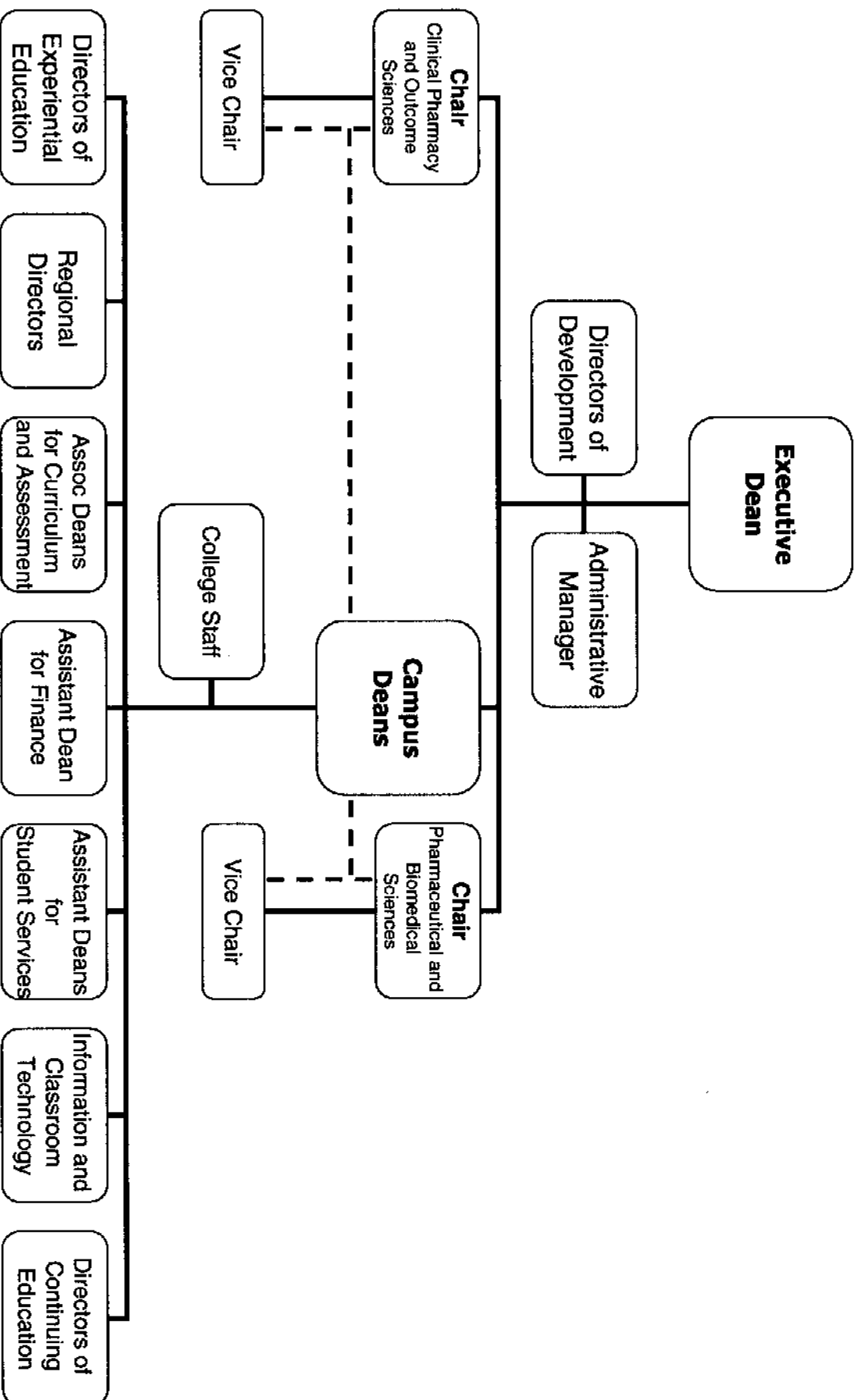
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SCCP Profile

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Joint Oversight Board

- Meet 2-3 times per year
- Establish procedures and review College progress
- Revising memorandum of understanding

- ACPPE reaffirmed accreditation for USC COP and MUSC COP
- “Candidate” status granted for SCCP

Accredited – after 1st class graduates



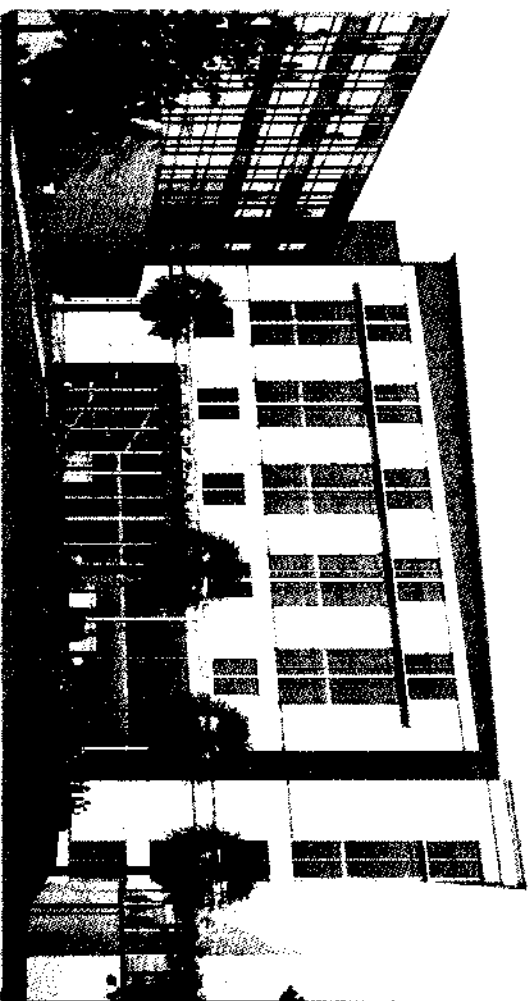
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Distance Education

- 2-way live audio / video transmission
- Instructors on both campuses
- Technical support personnel in classroom
- 60% of credit hours, 30% distance for individual student
- ~99% reliability of transmission
- Lectures recorded for student use (*Breeze*)
- *Blackboard* selected for classroom support

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The Upstate

- Hired Upstate Regional Director
 - Dr. Alyssa Smith
- Establishing agreements with GHS and SRH
- Timetable
 - Now – increased numbers of experiential students
 - 3 years – offer 3rd and 4th year in Upstate
 - 5-7 years – offer full program in Upstate
