



Boeing South Carolina Update – May 2016

400 and counting



Low-cost carrier Scoot took delivery of the 400th 787 Dreamliner on April 25, marking the fastest accomplishment of that many deliveries for any twin-aisle commercial airplane. It also is the fastest for any Commercial Airplanes jetliner since the 727 reached it 49 years ago.

The 400th 787 delivery, which took place right here at Boeing South Carolina, came four years and seven months after the first 787 delivery in September 2011. The 727 program reached that milestone in April 1967, three years and six months after its first delivery.

BSC teammates set record for 787 deliveries in one month

March 2016 was a month to remember for Boeing South Carolina, as our team set a new site record for airplane deliveries in a month, delivering eight 787s from BSC. Our previous site record was six. Boeing South Carolina Vice President and General Manager said the following in her congratulatory note to teammates:

On behalf of all the customers who flew home in spectacular new Dreamliners this month – Air Canada (3), Air Europa (1), LAN (2) and Virgin Atlantic (2) – thank you. Over the decades these eight airplanes will be in service, they will connect millions of passengers to locations around the globe.

We keep taking on challenging goals and proving we have the determination and skill to bring home the wins. We are silencing our skeptics by working together, sharing ideas and making this a great place to do business for our team and for our customers.



Adam Gorlitsky shares his story of inspiration with BSC teammates



The Boeing South Carolina Employees Ability Awareness Association hosted Adam Gorlitsky at our facility on April 13, where he was able to share his inspirational story with our teammates.

Ten years ago, Adam was paralyzed in a tragic car accident. He was told he would never walk again. Nearly a decade later, after many triumphs and heartbreaks along his journey, Adam is redefining what his normal is and has been given the opportunity to walk again. With the help of a robotic exoskeleton, called ReWalk, Adam is changing the game on what life looks like for

someone with a spinal cord injury.

Adam, always pushing boundaries, refuses to stop short of spectacular. On April 2 he became the first paralyzed man to walk in the historic Cooper River Bridge Run.

April was a busy month of community activity!

April was a huge month for Boeing in our community! We sponsored the Cooper River Bridge Run, Summerville Flowertown Festival, and RBC Heritage golf tournament during the month. Many of our teammates took part in or attended these events, and many more provided support in a volunteer capacity. Celebrating Earth Day, Boeing South Carolina style



Boeing South Carolina held an Earth Day event at its main campus on April 22 to promote the site's recycling programs. The event highlighted many of the site's efforts including what BSC is doing to recycle usable office equipment and how personal protective equipment, like high visibility vests and safety glasses, are reconditioned for reuse.

Here are some Earth-friendly facts about Boeing South Carolina that you may not know:

- In 2015, we recycled 524 tons of scrap metal, 458 tons of cardboard, 373 tons of paper, 1,930 tons of wood, and 246 tons of plastic. That's more than 3,500 tons of recycled materials!
- We are a Zero Waste to Landfill site. No waste generated from Boeing South Carolina ends up in local landfills. It is either recycled, repurposed, or sent to energy recovery facilities
- We are a 100 percent renewable energy site. We couple solar energy generated onsite with renewable energy credits through South Carolina Electric & Gas
- Speaking of solar, we have 10.5 acres of thin-film solar panels on the roof of our 787 Final Assembly building. Laid end to end they would stretch approximately 61 miles, and produce up to 2.6 megawatts of electricity – enough to power 250 residential homes!
- In 2014, we worked in partnership with federal, state and local agencies and conservation organizations to preserve approximately 4,000 acres of land, including more than 2,000 acres of wetlands near the Francis Marion National Forest as part of a comprehensive and wetlands mitigation plan
