

S. C. SOLDIERS ON WAY HOME FROM NAZI CAMPS

WITH U. S. FORCES IN FRANCE.—Eighty South Carolina soldiers and officers recently liberated from German prison camps are on their way back to the United States.

Their most vivid impression of the captivity is the starvation diet they received from their Nazi captors. Without American Red Cross food parcels, they said, they would not have survived the steady diet of black moldy bread and stinky butter soup-died on by the Germans.

They told how they endured hounding as they were marched from one prison camp to another while the Germans were retreating before advancing Allied armies. The forced marches, some of them crossing hundreds of miles, were made under constant strafing by Allied planes. While retreating, the Germans, they said, failed to provide adequate food and shelter for their prisoners.
