

Columbia, South Carolina
December 8, 1948

The Budget Commission met in the office of the State Auditor on December 8, 1948 at 11:00 o'clock. All members of the Commission were present.

The Commission reviewed the figures submitted by the State Auditor in line with its instructions and finding that the total to be recommended was within the anticipated revenues of the State for the next fiscal year, directed that the report be prepared and submitted to the General Assembly.

The following appropriation transfers were approved by the Commission:

The following allotments from the Civil Contingent Fund were granted by the Commission:

<u>State Forestry Commission</u> To provide funds for increasing the production of tree seedlings from 25,000,000 to 35,000,000 trees per year	\$15,000.00
<u>Secretary of State</u> For Freight Express and Deliveries	50.00
<u>W. R. Watson</u> For tabulating general election returns	150.00

The Commission declined to approve an allotment of \$15,000.00 to the Lyles-Ford Tri-County Authority to cover the cost of engineering.

The Commission declined to approve a request by the Industrial Schools Board to be permitted to increase the salary of the Superintendent of the Industrial School for Boys.

The Commission heard, but took no immediate action on, a request from E. N. Williams, State Supervisor of Negro Agricultural Extension work for an allotment of \$15,000.00 for additional facilities at Camp Harry Daniels.

The Commission deferred action on a request from the Industrial School for Boys for a transfer of \$18,200.00 from Vocational Training to Structural and Non-Structural Improvements.

The Commission declined to approve a transfer requested by the Public Service Commission for the purpose of increasing two salaries in the Department.

The Commission then adjourned.
