

Articles Valued at \$1,500 Recovered; Three Arrested

Columbia detectives have recovered furniture, appliances, and miscellaneous articles valued at some \$1,500 and arrested three brothers for investigation in connection with a series of house-breakings.

Listed on the court docket were a 17-year-old and a 19-year-old youth. A 16-year-old youth was turned over to juvenile authorities.

Detectives W. V. Eleazer and R. E. McMahon, who investigated, said the recovered articles — including some big items such as refrigerators and a stove — were taken from homes or apartments at Gonzales Gardens, Washington

Carver Village, Tree Street, King Street, and Santee Avenue. Other items were taken from salesmen's automobiles, they added.

The thefts occurred over a period of some eight months, the detectives said, and generally occurred at homes or apartments from which occupants had just moved or into which they were just moving.

The items were found at the youths' home and some were being used, the detectives said.

Detective B. C. Inabinet and Acting Detective T. M. Sharpe aided in serving warrants in the case, Detectives Eleazer and McMahon said.
