M I N U T E S

A MEETING OF THE ANDERSON COUNTY COUNCIL WAS HELD ON SEPTEMBER 17, 1985 AT 7:00 P.M. IN THE ANDERSON COUNTY COUNCIL CHAMBERS - ROOM 109. CHAIRMAN DAN RHODES PRESIDED.

Mr. Rhodes called the meeting to order and Mr. Wiles gave the invocation. Everyone stood and pledged allegiance to the flag.

On the motion of Mr. Wiles, seconded by Mr. Beebe, Council voted unanimously to approve the August 27 and September 5, 1985 minutes as mailed.

Mr. Rhodes presented the third and final reading of Ordinance #176 (Tax Roll Back) for Council's consideration. Mr. Rhodes moved that the ordinance be adopted. Mr. Hooper seconded. Vote was unanimous (5-0).

Ms. Diane Slater and other residents from Lakecrest Subdivision came before Council complaining about installation of WesPel Cable TV in the subdivision. Mr. Rhodes recognized Mr. John Rogers from WesPel Cable TV and asked for his assistance with the complaint. The Council allowed the citizens and Mr. Rogers to meet in the adjacent room to work out a solution to their problem. Ms. Slater also asked Council to consider their subdivision for road repair and grass cutting. The chairman referred her to Mr. Beebe.

Mr. Hooper moved that a resolution (#292) be approved and sent to the President asking that he support legislation restricting textile imports in order to save jobs. Mr. Cox seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous.

Mr. Bob Palmer of Russell & Axon, presented preliminary plans for a proposed administrative building for the County Jail. Mr. Beebe moved that the administrator begin grading, in conjunction with road maintenance, of the site and proceed with plans to put the project out for bids. Mr. Rhodes seconded. Vote was unanimous.

Mr. Mike Mullinax presented Resolution #291 and assistance agreement for ERD Systems, Inc. for Council's approval. Mr. Beebe moved that the resolution be approved. Mr. Wiles seconded. Vote was unanimous to approve the resolution as presented.

Mr. Mullinax presented first reading of Ordinance #177 - an ordinance to regulate the licensing and operation of pawnbrokers in Anderson County. Mr. Wiles moved to approve on first reading. Mr. Hooper seconded. Vote was 5-0.

Mr. Watson presented the road maintenance activity report for Council's information.

Mr. Watson presented third and final reading of Ordinance #175 - amendment #1 to original ordinance #171 - 1985-86 budget. Mr. Cox moved that the ordinance be approved. Mr. Hooper seconded the motion and vote was 5-0.

Mr. Watson presented the split budgets for the Election Commission and Registration Board as requested by Council at the September 5, 1985 meeting. The Election Commission's proposed budget amount - \$58,471 and the Registration Board - \$48,640. He also asked Council to approve a \$5,000 budget transfer (Registration Board - Account #160) from object 15 (travel) to Account #160 - object 01 (salaries) as requested by Mrs. Marney Thomas of the Registration Board. Mr. Hooper moved that the request be granted. Mr. Beebe seconded the motion and vote was 5-0.

Mr. Bob Daniel of the Greene, Lindley Company, gave a computer system update. The payroll system was implemented on August 20, 1985. The general ledger/accounts payable system was implemented on September 1, 1985. The Treasurer's office and Auditor's Office will be implemented during the weekend of September 28, 1985 and the following week. The Family Court system will be implemented as soon as the various forms are received. The Assessor's systems will begin implementation on October 10, 1985. Council received as information.

Council heard from concerned citizens at this time. Mr. Jack Symons presented the value of one mill in 1985 for Anderson County Council and requested that the Council consider an ordinance that would control the future expenditure of excess tax collected this fiscal year. Council received as information.

There being no further business, Council adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
