BILL BACKGROUND:

- Requires state and local law enforcement agencies to implement the use of body-worn cameras in accordance with guidelines issued by the Law Enforcement Training Council conditioned upon funding.
- Requires these guidelines to be completed and published within 180 days of the effective date of the Act.
- State and local agencies have an additional 90 days to write local policies and submit them to the LETC for approval.
- Creates a body-worn cameras fund and allows agencies to apply for funding assistance once their local policies are approved. The bill does not identify a source of revenue for this fund.
- Exempts the footage from FOIA.
- The fiscal impact of this bill is about \$34 million in the first two years.
- Passed Senate (41-1 Bright), House (113-0).
