Dear Senator Hutto:

Thank you for letter regarding Medicaid Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention Services (MAPPS) and the agency's decision to eliminate it beginning January 1, 2009. This decision is largely a result of the 3% across-the-board cut ordered by the Budget and Control Board on August 12, 2008. That action translates into \$28.5 million reduction in state funds for the Medicaid program.

While we know MAPPS can be a valuable tool in addressing the problem of teen pregnancy, counseling services of this type are generally outside the scope of Medicaid's core mission to provide medical care coverage. By way of background, MAPPS is a service that was once funded through Department of Social Services (DSS) as part of their Teen Companion program. The service was moved to Department of Health and Human Services in 2001 because of a reduction in DSS funding.

Since many MAPPS providers also offer a range of other counseling services unrelated to teen pregnancy prevention, it has proven difficult to obtain the proper service documentation that the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services requires in order to match state expenditures with federal dollars.

My staff and I met with Mr. Alton on October 1 and explained the agency's view. I also offered him my assurance that we will have continued dialogue about MAPPS and the teen pregnancy issue in general. We will also open discussions with other state agencies, such as DHEC, to identify other potential strategies to combat teen pregnancy. Since Medicaid pays for 85 percent of all teen births in South Carolina, we have a vested interest in trying to reduce this very serious problem.
