COMPANY OVERVIEW:

United Parcel Service, Inc. (UPS) is the world's largest package delivery company and a provider of supply chain management solutions. The global logistics company is headquartered in Sandy Springs, Georgia, which is part of the Greater Atlanta metropolitan area. UPS delivers more than 15 million packages a day to more than 6.1 million customers in more than 220 countries and territories around the world.[]

On August 28, 1907, James Casey founded the American Messenger Company with fellow teenager Claude Ryan in Seattle, Washington, capitalized with \$100 in debt. In 1913, the first delivery car appeared, a Model T Ford. Casey and Ryan merged with a competitor, Evert McCabe, and formed Merchants Parcel Delivery. Consolidated delivery was also introduced, combining packages addressed to a certain neighborhood onto one delivery vehicle.

In 1930, a consolidated service began in New York City, and soon after in other major cities in the East and the Midwest. In 1937, the logo was redesigned to reflect the company's new name United Parcel Service. All UPS vehicles are then painted Pullman brown. In 1937, The UPS logo is revised for the first time; it then included the tagline "The Delivery System for Stores of Quality."

SC Involvement

- UPS has five major service centers in South Carolina located in Charleston, West Columbia, Florence, Gaffney and Greenville.
- The West Columbia Facility received \$50,000,000 in equipment upgrades to further automate systems.
- There are 1340 UPS employees in West Columbia, and 2225 UPS employees in the state of South Carolina.

- An example of this is the upgrade, which UPS made to its package sorting facility here last year.

- For example, over the next decade, approximately \$2 billion will be invested in port and port-related improvements, including the deepening of the Charleston Harbor to 52-feet.
