Gov. Nikki Haley backed the decision to not issue an AMBER Alert when a the mother of five slain children said she did not know of their whereabouts this month.

**Note:** "How do you do an Amber Alert out for somebody who the courts gave primary custody to?," Haley told The State on Friday. "I think that (State Law Enforcement Division) Chief (Mark) Keel and SLED followed it the way it was. ... I think they did what they were supposed to do for this family."
