> The NHC upgraded Tropical Depression Two to Tropical Storm Bonnie as of the 1700 advisory. However, this upgrade does not significantly change the previously forecasted potential impacts from the system.

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> Moving at 10 mph, TS Bonnie is located about 125 miles SSE of Charleston with maximum sustained winds of 40 mph. Some areas of the coast are already seeing rain and gusty winds.

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> It is possible that winds may increase to 45 mph sustained before Bonnie weakens. Rainfall is still predicted to be in the 1-3 inch range with the possibility of higher amounts in some areas. There may be storm surge in the 1-2 feet range during the Sunday morning high tide. An isolated tornado or two will be possible late tonight and early Sunday from the coast back through central SC. TS warnings remain in effect along our entire coast.

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> There are no change in county activities from this morning and unlikely to be any unless the situation changes. Horry County EOC remains activated for Bikefest.

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
