Unfortunately he also had his eye on another girl and I told him he needed to make a choice and he chose her. Their relationship was a toxic one. She would do her best to get him into fights, go drinking, around drugs. They say a woman can make or break a man and she definitely broke him. I kept in contact with his family for years and one day I saw him on Charleston's most wanted. After a few months he crossed my mind and I searched the D.O.C website and there he was. I began to write, call and visit. At this time I was married so it was strictly a friendship. Well that friendship has grown over the ten years that he has been incarcerated. I have watched him go from an immature, scared, insecure "tough" guy to a strong, secure, godly man who attends church, studies, works hard. Even at one time sending the money to his ex for their daughters on his own accord. Unfortunately she is still living a toxic

life and he found out she was spending the money he was sending on drugs and alcohol. He was heartbroken, beaten down but put his faith even more into God. He was transferred to Allendale to take classes and it was at that facility that we were able to attend church "together". Seacoast has an outreach program. I am an active member of Seacoast so we were able to discuss the sermons and how we interpreted what was said. Our relationship grew stronger becoming best friends. I set up an email account for his daughters, so that they could establish a relationship with him after 9 years. The girls are not in a good environment, Governor Haley, they need a Godly, loving home without drugs where they are shown affection and discipline. Charles is the epitome of what the system is designed for. He went in as one man and has grown and developed into a man who can contribute to society.

I have lived in Summerville 28 years. I am a business owner, a college graduate, loving mother and this year I saw enough change in him to ask HIM to marry ME.

I have been by his side his entire incarceration. His family has been there as well. He has the Support and love that a man needs to make a difference in the world. Let's Save the State the \$45,000 that it will cost to keep him in Macdougall over the next 3 years. Please let me know what I can do to apply for an early release for him.
