Lieutenant Governor Bryant Announces Permanent Improvement Project Grant for Senior Site in Boiling Springs

BOILING SPRINGS, S.C. – Lieutenant Governor Kevin Bryant is pleased to announce that a total of \$43,101 has been awarded to Boiling Springs Community Park through funds provided by the

Lieutenant Governor's Office on Aging's Senior Center Permanent Improvement Project (PIP) grant program. This award amount is in addition to a required local match, as stipulated by the program's guidelines.

An award ceremony and general remarks are scheduled for 11:00 a.m. on Friday, June 8, 2018, at 182 Rainbow Lake Road in Boiling Springs. Lieutenant Governor Kevin Bryant and other project partners will be available for media interviews at the conclusion of program remarks.

The PIP funds will be used to pave an existing gravel parking lot at the Boiling Springs Community Park senior site. The paving project will bring the parking lot up-to-date with current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements, while increasing the center's ability to serve seniors, especially those who may have mobility issues.

"An active senior lifestyle encourages independence and enhances overall quality of life," says Lieutenant Governor Bryant. "We hope that this improvement will allow the Spartanburg Council on Aging to expand its reach in the Boiling Springs community, and I am very appreciative of the area leaders who have worked so hard to make this project happen."

The Senior Center Permanent Improvement Project (PIP) grant program was established by the General Assembly in 1991. Administered by the Lieutenant Governor's Office on Aging, the PIP grant program has since funded necessary construction and renovations projects at senior sites throughout the state.

While the Boiling Springs Community Park, a partner of the Spartanburg Council on Aging, is the recipient of the PIP funds, the Appalachian Council of Governments and Area Agency on Aging is the grantee. All funds are disbursed to the grantee through a reimbursement system when certified invoices are submitted to the Lieutenant Governor's Office on Aging and approved.
