Sugarcane (*Saccharum officinarum*) is sprouting in the garden at Charles Towne Landing State Historic Site – in the same spot where English colonists planted it in the 1670s! The Carolina colony, however, never became a sugar producer because the winters proved too cold. Stop by the garden and chart the cane's progress – its purple stem should be visible soon.
