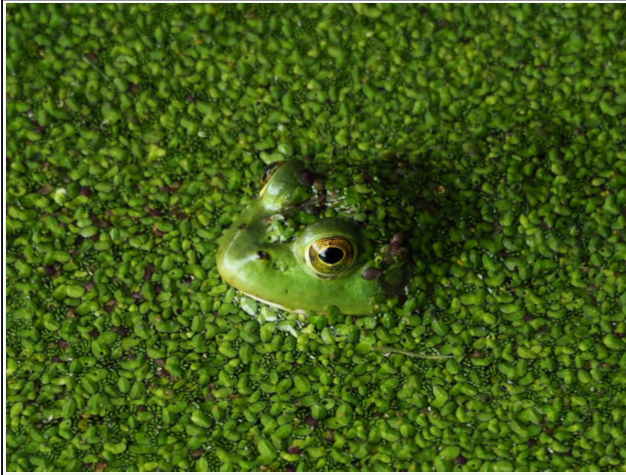

Named for its deep and noisy croak, the American Bullfrog is the largest frog species in North America. Bullfrogs are active both day and night and have quite an appetite, eating anything from insects to snakes and they have even been known to feed on birds! In spring, the female bullfrog will lay between 10,000 and 25,000 eggs and it will take approximately two years for the tadpoles to undergo metamorphosis.
