

MINUTES OF BUDGET MEETING

August 30, 1945

The Budget Commission met in the Governor's Office at 11:00 o'clock on August 30, 1945. All members of the Commission were present.

The following allotments were authorized from the Civil Contingent Fund:

Miss Mary Alice Floyd, Woodruff, S. C., \$454.00, to reimburse her for hospital and other bills paid by her in connection with injuries sustained in an automobile wreck in October, 1940, while attending a Selective Service registration meeting at Spartanburg, S. C.

Dr. Josiah E. Smith, Charleston, S. C., \$323.00, to cover bill of Miss Gladys Thompson for services rendered in connection with an automobile wreck in October, 1940, while attending a Selective Service registration meeting at Spartanburg, S. C.

In connection with the above allotments from the Civil Contingent Fund, the Secretary was instructed to advise the teachers who were injured in the automobile wreck referred to that the State would no longer carry responsibility for expenses arising from the accident.

Approval was given to the Research, Planning and Development Board to employ the following:

Howard E. Glenn, as Chief of the Planning Division, at a salary of \$4800.00 per annum.

U. X. Cullum as Field Engineer, at a salary of \$3600.00 per annum.

Authority was granted to the Superintendent of the Penitentiary to construct a building to be used for guard quarters, office, commissary, cook room, and dining room at a cost of approximately \$3,000.00; and to extend the railroad spur at the Penitentiary approximately 400 feet, to facilitate the handling of coal and other freight delivered to the Penitentiary, at an estimated cost of \$1500.00. Funds for these projects are to be supplied from the current revenues of the Penitentiary.
