SECTION 1: The Minutes for the meeting of August 15, 1991; copies of which had been previously mailed to each member of the Commission, were approved.

SECTION 2: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving monthly reports as published by the Department of activities for the months of June, July and August 1991.

SECTION 3: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving purchase orders issued for amounts in excess of \$10,000.00 during the month of August 1991, as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 4: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving payment of the \$60,000.00 for Phase 2 of the Highway Users Federation study from the Highway Fund balance, as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 5: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to enter into Supplemental Agreement No. 4 with Parsons, Brinckerhoff, Quade and Douglas, Inc. to provide additional engineering services for U. S. Route 501 from Conway to Myrtle Beach at a cost of \$475,000.00, as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 6: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to enter into an agreement with Burton, Adams, Kemp and King, Inc. to provide Phase 1 environmental and engineering services for improvements to North Rhett Avenue in Berkeley and Charleston counties at an estimated cost of \$550,000.00, as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 7: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to enter into an agreement with Carolinas Transportation Compact to participate in a study examining the feasibility of establishing a two-state Regional Transportation Authority between North Carolina and South Carolina at a total cost to the Department of \$9,000.00, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 8: The Commission unanimously passed a motion amending the FY '91-92 Program of Projects for Public Transportation as amended to include the Statewide Performance Evaluation Program for a total cost of \$125,000.00, as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 9: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to select a consulting firm to provide right of way acquisition, appraisal and relocation assistance services on an "on call" basis for a contract period of two years at an estimated cost of \$750,000.00, as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 10: The Commission unanimously passed a motion accepting a report of the Department concerning the execution of a gratis quitclaim deed dated September 9, 1991 conveying 0.51 acre of land in Berkeley County to Alumax Corporation and Berkeley Aluminum, Inc., as shown in the Appendix.

FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR A TWO STATE
REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY

The Department requests Commission approval to enter into an agreement with the Carolinas Transportation Compact (CTC) in order to participate in a study that will examine the feasibility of establishing a two-state Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) for the Charlotte, North Carolina-South Carolina urban region. The CTC is a consortium of thirteen (13) North Carolina and South Carolina counties as follows: The North Carolina counties are Anson, Cabarrus, Catawba, Cleveland, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Rowan, Stanly and Union. The South Carolina counties are Lancaster and York.

The proposed study will assess the region's socio-economic demographic and travel patterns; estimate transportation demand and potential use of mass transportation services; evaluate all facets of mass transportation services (i.e. carpools, vanpools, bus transit, urban rail and commuter services); develop a process for local and state government involvement and decision-making; determine cost to provide, as well as impacts on the region of, different types of transportation service and improvements; and present financing alternatives and legislative requirements. The end product of this study will be a blueprint that the local governments and the two states can use in establishing a RTA for providing mass transportation to the region. The study will be contracted through the CTC and the University of North Carolina at Charlotte.

It is estimated that this study will cost approximately \$105,000. Of the total cost, the Department's share would be \$9,000; the North Carolina Department of Transportation's share would be \$66,000; and the remaining cost (\$30,000) would come from the CTC. The funds requested for the Department's share (\$9,000) for this study will come from unexpended State General Funds which the FY 1991-92 State Appropriations Act authorizes to be brought forward from the previous year.

AMENDMENT TO THE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION FY '91-'92 PROGRAM OF PROJECTS

RE: Performance Evaluation Program

At the Commission's June 20, 1991 and July 18, 1991 meetings, the Department approved and amended (respectively) the FY '91-'92 Public Transportation Program of Projects. Not included in the authorization was a grant approved by the Urban Mass Transportation (UMTA) which would allow the Department to administer, develop and implement a Statewide Performance Evaluation Program. The program aims to effectively gauge the productivity of transit providers in South Carolina. Funding for the project is 80% UMTA federally funded (\$100,000) and 20% State matched (State Highway Funds -- \$12,198; State General Fund -- \$12,800).

It is, therefore, recommended that the Commission approve amending the FY'91-92 Program of Projects, as amended (7/18/91) to include the Statewide Performance Evaluation Program for a total project cost of \$125,000. The breakdown of the project is as follows:

RIGHT OF WAY CONSULTANT

The Department requests Commission approval to select and negotiate with consulting firms to provide right of way acquisition, appraisal, and relocation assistance services on an "on call" basis. GOALS AND OBJECTIVES FOR MR. MCLELLAN, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

FISCAL YEAR 1991-1992

- 1) Develop a revenue package to present to the General Assembly for fiscal year 1992-1993.

Success criteria:

This package will be comprehensive, including an assessment of needs for all divisions within the department; projections for growth in terms of personnel, office space and equipment; and focusing on the need to better utilize existing money to match the available federal dollars. The plan includes visiting with each legislative delegation and presenting the department's package to them in advance of submitting the package to the General Assembly in January. It is my desire to have this package introduced as legislation in January and have debate begin on the bill during the 1992 legislative session.

- 2) Develop a civilian component for the weight and measures team.

Success criteria:

A classification/compensation system will be established to attract competent civilians as members of the weight and measures team. This will allow the Department to better utilize commissioned officers for law enforcement initiatives.

- 3) Monitor and track the pending legislation to reorganize the South Carolina Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

Success criteria:

Meet with the primary sponsors of both the House and Senate versions of the reorganization bill to reach a workable compromise in the best interest of the state.

- 4) Monitor pending federal legislation and resist Congress' attempt to levy a \$.05 increase in the gasoline tax at the federal level.

Success criteria:

Work for a continuing resolution to maintain the present federal funding package. An additional federal tax will be opposed until South Carolina's revenues allow us to obtain present available federal money.

- 5) Work with the Division of Motor Vehicles' employees to adequately staff public windows and telephone lines to better serve the citizens of our state.

Success criteria:

- 6) Continue to speak to civic clubs and organizations to improve the Department's public image.

Success criteria:

To the best of my ability, all requests for talks and speeches will be accepted.

- 7) Comply with the Legislative Audit Council's recent audit concerning the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise program with the Department.

Success criteria:

Work with the Reorganization Commission's Compliance Review Committee to comply with the audit exceptions.

- 8) Develop and promote an esprit de corps among all our employees, encouraging a "Can Do" attitude while serving the public.

Success criteria:

Compliment employees for outstanding achievement, visit each division and encourage each employee to have a positive attitude, and implement a Department "dress casual" day on a quarterly basis.

**GUIDELINES FOR COMMISSION TRAVEL
REIMBURSEMENTS AND PER DIEM**

Commissioners attending official meetings or conducting other business of the Department are entitled to the following travel expenses:

- (1) Per diem at the rate of \$35.00 per day for official Commission or Committee meetings (FOI notice required)
- (2) Reimbursement for actual expenses incurred for lodging (receipt required by Budget and Control Board - Single Room Rate). No reimbursement within 50 miles of residence.
- (3) Actual expenses incurred for meals not to exceed \$20.00 per day in State and \$32.00 per day out of State.
- (4) Use of personal vehicle while traveling on necessary official business shall be reimbursed at 25.5 cents per mile; documentation to be through travel log form.
- (5) Miscellaneous - Cab fare or baggage handling.
- (6) Air Fare (Tourist Class)
- (7) Out of State travel required written prior approval by the Commission Chairman.
- (8) Use of State planes requires written prior approval by the Commission Chairman.
