Community Insight: 2013 NASA Shared Services Center

Michael Smith and the NASA Shared Services Center are the stars of this week's Insight. The 2013 Shared Services Summit presentation talks about NSSC's data-driven approach to Shared Services, and has a fantastic and lengthy Q&A Session. From the program:

The National Aeronautical and Space Administration (NASA) Shared Services Center (NSSC) opened March 1, 2006, on the grounds of Stennis Space Center in Mississippi. Since then, the NSSC has grown to provide more than 50 select business activities including financial management, human resources, information technology, procurement and business support services. As a \$453 million enterprise with a workforce of 559 people, NSSC is now looking to optimize its model by providing better quality, more timely services at lower costs; improving data integrity, consistency and accountability; standardizing core business processes; facilitating process re-engineering and automation; and leveraging consolidated spending with vendors to negotiate better terms and prices.

Community Feature Spotlight: Invite-a-Colleague Revisited!

This week, we want to remind you of a recently added feature to the Community of Practice: Invite-a-Colleague. It was one of our most requested feature additions, and we're quite excited to be able to bring it to the community.

With Invite-a-Colleague, we're allowing you, the practitioners, to help grow the community. If you have coworkers to whom you would like to give access to the Community, or professional acquaintances you think would be a good addition, then this feature makes inviting them simple. We're letting you be the judge of who you think would make a good addition to the community. We're not limiting access in any way.

Inviting colleagues is straightforward. First, simply [go to the Invite Page](#) on the Community. The first field asks for a list of email addresses. For every person you want to invite, simply put their email address in this field. Separate them with a comma, or by putting each email on a new line. Finally, hit the send button, and the Community will automatically give those you invite full access to the Community of Practice. All they have to do is complete the registration form, and they'll be ready to go!
