Dear Governor Haley,

I first want to congratulate you on your success in being able to be our governor AGAIN!! I pray that you and your staff will be able to continue to turn our state around.

I am basically pleading with you to help me!! I have been diagnosed with several things that unfortunately have made it impossible for me to work. I have two doctors that have written letters stating this and so, I have applied for disability. I have been denied twice and am now, since April, waiting on a court date for a judge to determine to grant it. I have three concerns and they are as follows:

1. When a doctor (two in my case) has determined that I cannot work, WHY have I been denied twice?
2. WHY do the state and or judge determine my fate?
3. WHY does this process of disability take two years or more?

The conditions that I have include interstitial cystitis (and all the details that I won't go into with this), depression, borderline personality disorder and PTSD (from rape at gunpoint here in this state). I have tried to work throughout the years and the longest I have held a job was five years. Trust me, I would rather work, but between all the doctor appointments, treatments, FMLA, panic attacks and pain it is just impossible. I am fighting with my long term disability carrier, Prudential, that my work has and I am fighting with the disability board. I have gotten Binder and Binder to "help" because they don't need any money up front and take money if I am deemed disabled. I am tired of fighting. I just want to give up. If it weren't for my husband, I would be literally living on the streets. Since I cannot work, our income has decreased, needless to say. I know that I didn't make very much to begin with, but every little bit helps. If something happens to my husband or our marriage, I am sunk. Just because the money stops coming in, doesn't mean the bills stop!!

I'm at the end of my rope. I am in pain 24/7 and NOONE should have to fight this long to get an answer from the disability board. I

don't think it is right or fair that if a doctor deems you unable to work, that a person should have their lives decided by a judge.

Please, can you do anything to help or expedite this process?
