manufacturer to add 23 jobs*

The South Carolina Department of Commerce recently released its November 2013 Economic

Outlook report. The monthly report forecasts positive economic growth for the year ahead. The South Carolina Leading Index (SCLI) marked three consecutive months of improvement and reached a six-year high in October, closing the month at 101.24. An SCLI value above 100 indicates improving economic conditions for the state over the coming three to six months. Strong stock market performance and an increase in the average manufacturing workweek pushed the SCLI higher in the state.

## Devro to invest \$60M in Calhoun plant expansion

*Company plans to transform facility into a high-speed, highly efficient plant*

Devro Inc., a producer of manufactured sausage casings for the food industry, plans to invest \$60 million to transform its 37-year-old facility at Sandy Run, in Calhoun County, into a high-speed, highly efficient plant that will facilitate the company's growth strategy.

The largest investment in Devro Inc.'s history, the expansion will include the construction of a new manufacturing plant at the same site as the existing plant, which is located about 35 miles from Columbia. The new plant will be a fully integrated manufacturing complex.
