

Columbia, South Carolina
February 13, 1952

The Budget and Control Board met in the Governor's office on February 13, 1952 at 10:30 A. M. All members of the Board were present except Mr. Bates.

The Director of the Property and Sinking Funds Division was instructed to arrange for the renovation of the recently purchased Coca-Cola building to the lowest bidder.

The Director was also instructed to arrange for housing all state agencies at present renting outside office space and to rent any surplus space in the building.

The Board then adjourned.

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A meeting of the State Budget and Control Board, Division of Sinking Funds and Property, was held in the office of the Governor on Wednesday morning, February 13, 1952. All members were present.

Bids for renovation of Coca Cola Building were submitted as follows:

Atlantic Building Corporation	13,000.00


The Atlantic Building Corporation being low, the contract was awarded to said Corporation.

Action on Resolution regarding the employment of W. Brantley Harvey as attorney to represent the State in establishing title to certain former salt marsh land in Beaufort County was deferred.

The Board approved action of the Director in authorizing the additional expenditure of \$1,250.00 under contract with General Automatic Sprinkler Company for installation of sprinkler systems in buildings of South Carolina State Hospital at State Park, for the purpose of making additional cross connections in the water mains as required by engineers of Associated Factory Mutuals.

The Comptroller General stated that he had talked with the firm of Wm. G. Lyles, Bisset, Carlisle & Wolff, Architects, with regard to remodeling certain areas in basement of State House into file rooms for his Department. The Board authorized the Director to request this firm to ask for bids on this project; the cost to be paid from the Contingent Fund after approval by the Director.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
