Dear Governor Haley.

I am a native of Kingstree and descended from a long line of South Carolinians who served SC in the Revolutionary War and the Civil War. My great great grandfather and other family members died in SC under the battle flag of the Army of Northern Virginia. I have always believed that the battle flag was used only in a historical or memorial context. I lament its being misappropriated by hate groups (the most notorious of which also used the US flag and the Christian cross) and also its use in popular culture like beach towels or car decals. I did not agree with the flag flying over the state house as I understood it was there to represent opposition to civil rights. I supported the move of the flag to fly beside the graves of the men and boys who died fighting for SC in the Civil War. I understand that flying the flag every day is an issue for many people, however, taking it down and heaping it with the sort of scorn we have seen in the terrible shooting in Charleston is also an issue for many of us. It is as if all the sins of racism and slavery in this country are being all too conveniently assigned solely to those who fought for the Confederacy and we forget that slavery was legal in every state for some time. Slavery had a foundation in the US Constitution as well as that of the CSA. Slavery existed under the US flag for approximately 80 years. Those ships that kidnapped or purchased Africans on that terrible voyage across the Atlantic did not fly the Confederate flag rather the US flag or those of Great Britain, Portugal, Spain, France or the Netherlands. Slave owners and abolitionists fought in both armies and truth be told most people of the time were white supremacists (including President Lincoln). Most of the country at one time supported and benefited in some way from slavery. The South. Most of the men and boys who fought in the Confederate army did not own slaves and I

Memorial but only once a year on Memorial Day. To do otherwise will dishonor those men who died in South Carolina and tell their descendants that South Carolina does not appreciate their sacrifice. Make no mistake, a wholesale assault on the men who fought for the Confederacy is part of the modern US culture war. Those who would not accept the flag being flown on Memorial Day do not care about those of us who appreciate the sacrifices those men made. It is an effort to denigrate the South and Southerners. Those martial traditions significantly forged during the Civil War have served our country well in every war since as Southern soldiers disproportionately served in the military. To scorn those traditions now, which is what many seem to be doing, would be a mistake. I hope that you will reconsider your position and advocate the use of the flag for its memorial as well as historical purposes. Thank you for your consideration of my comments. I recognize this is a difficult issue and I hope you and the legislature make the right decision-one that considers the historical view of the Battle Flag of the Army of Northern Virginia held by all South Carolinians.

I think there was a statement by you that the state's rebel flag that we all know by now wasn't about but about your state's lowest common denominator's intolerance. I will write what Wikipedia said a REAL civil war flag of the Southern States during it's evolution.

"...As a people we are fighting maintain the Heaven-ordained supremacy of the white man over the colored race; a white flag would thus be emblematical of our cause.

-William T. Thompson (April 23, 1863), Daily Morning News

However, the official Confederate flag act of 1864 did not formally state what the white-colored field symbolized and thus, many Confederates at the time offered various interpretations. The Confederates debated whether the white field should have a blue stripe and whether it should be bordered in red. designer, W.T. Thompson opposed adding any such additional elements to the white field.

William Miles delivered a speech supporting the simple white design that was eventually approved that the battle flag must be used, but for a national flag it was necessary to emblazon it, but as simple with a plain white field. In May 1863, when Thompson discovered that his design had been chosen Confederate Congress to become the Confederacy's next national flag, he was pleased. He praised it symbolizing the Confederacy's ideology and its cause of "a superior race", as well as for bearing little resemblance to the U.S. flag, which he called the "infamous banner of the Yankee vandals". Writing in Savannah's Daily Morning News, Thompson stated:

"As a national emblem, it is significant of our higher cause, the cause of a superior race, and a high contending against ignorance, infidelity, and barbarism. Another merit in the new flag is, that it bears resemblance to the now infamous banner of the Yankee vandals."

There is no justification for racism. You have called yourself a leader of "the new South" and I don't leave you one last quote by a learned author, as you have a choice. I see intolerance and bigotry as well as ignorance and you have a chance to bring your state out of that or comply with the stupid:

"There is a cult of ignorance in the United States, and there always has been. The strain of anti-intellect has been a constant thread winding its way through our political and cultural life, nurtured by the false notion that democracy means that "my ignorance is just as good as your knowledge."

Column in Newsweek (21 January 1980) - "A Cult of Ignorance", Newsweek, 21 January 1980

You decide, do you want to go down in history as a bigot who pandered to other bigots or are you going the way to change and progress. Another state, Georgia, banned Ray Charles because he once refused to perform at a Jim Crow concert. They came back decades later and recognised him and admitted their own ignorance and intolerance as they welcomed him posthumously, making "Georgia" their state song. Change comes one step at a time. I hope you will take it.
