The regular monthly meeting of the Department of Transportation Commission was held at the headquarters building in Columbia, South Carolina at 9:00 a.m. on January 27, 1999. SECTION 1: Chairman Limehouse called the meeting to order and expressed his gratitude to the Commission and staff for the hard work and dedication during his tenure as Chairman of the Commission. Chairman Limehouse passed the gavel to Mr. Morgan Martin, the newly appointed Chairman of the SCDOT Commission. Chairman Martin thanked Mr. Limehouse for his service. Chairman Martin then called on Commissioner Bobby Jones for a presentation.

On behalf of the members of the Commission, Commissioner Jones presented Chairman Limehouse with a resolution honoring his service as Chairman of the South Carolina Department of Transportation Commission. Resolution is shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 2: The Minutes for the meeting of December 18, 1998; copies of which had been previously sent to each member of the Commission, were approved.

SECTION 3: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise for and select a consulting firm for the purpose of reviewing the prepared draft of SCDOT version of the Standard Specifications for Seismic Design of Highway Bridges, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 4: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise for and select a consulting firm or firms for the purpose of providing engineering and right of way acquisition services for the widening of SC Route 146 in Greenville, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 5: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise for and select a consultant to provide treated wood inspection services on an "on call" basis, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 6: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select consultant(s) to provide environmental services on an "on call" basis, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 7: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select a consultant to provide diving services to perform underwater bridge inspection, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 8: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select a consultant engineering firm to provide "on call" foundation testing services, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 9: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select a consulting firm or firms for the purpose of providing design services for the widening of SC Route 24 in Anderson, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 10: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing bituminous retreatment contracts to include additional resurfacing work, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 11: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 12: The Commission unanimously passed a motion adding sections of roads to the State Highway System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 13: The Commission unanimously passed a motion rescinding its action in adding roads to the State Highway System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 14: The Commission unanimously passed a motion removing roads sections from the State Highway System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

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SECTION 15: On motion of Commissioner Hardee, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion approving a resolution naming that bridge on US 378 at Little Horse Creek in Lexington County the "Jake Knotts Bridge". Resolution is shown in detail in the Appendix. 

SECTION 16: On motion of Commissioner Truluck, seconded by Commissioner Hardee, the Commission unanimously passed a motion approving a resolution naming that portion of Highway 521 from its intersection with Highway 377 westerly to the Greeleyville city limits as the "Dr. Benjamin J. Gordon Jr. Memorial Highway". Resolution is shown in detail in the Appendix. 

SECTION 17: On motion of Commissioner Truluck, seconded by Commissioner Hardee, the Commission unanimously passed a motion approving a resolution naming the intersection of US 52 and SC 375 in Williamsburg as "Gamble Crossroad", as shown in detail in the Appendix. 

SECTION 18: On motion of Commissioner Truluck, seconded by Commissioner Hardee, the Commission unanimously passed a motion naming the intersection of Highway 162 and 165 in Hollywood as the "Herbert Gadson Intersection". Resolution is shown in detail in the Appendix. 

SECTION 19: On motion of Commissioner Goodstein, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion to support the constitutional amendment/division of gas tax revenue legislation introduced by Senator Passailaigue.

SECTION 20: On motion of Commissioner Self, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion opposing Senate Bill 234.

SECTION 21: On motion of Commissioner Self, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion opposing the Senate bill requiring the Department to install driveways for businesses.

SECTION 22: On motion of Commissioner Goodstein, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission passed a motion to concur with the Department's recommendations that regulations governing the interstate logo program be revised to allow businesses open 6 days per week to participate in the program; to allow trailblazer signs to give directional information to businesses participating in the logo program which require additional motorist guidance; to amend the regulations concerning ramp signs in the logo program; and to allow for maximum use of logo panels at double interchange exits. Commissioner Hardee abstained from voting on this motion.

January 27, 1999

SECTION 23: On motion of Commissioner Truluck, seconded by Commissioner Goodstein, the Commission unanimously passed a motion to endorse the I-95/I-26 interchange in Orangeburg County as a high priority project and authorized the staff to either perform the work internally or hire a consulting firm to perform a feasibility study for the appropriate preliminary engineering on the project.

SECTION 24: On motion of Commissioner Hardee, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to move forward with preliminary engineering for the Calhoun/Clarendon Causeway project.

SECTION 25: On motion of Commissioner Hardee, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to proceed with the S. C. Route 277 pedestrian walkway in Richland County.

SECTION 26: There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 12:10 p.m.

WHEREAS, as chairman of the Transportation Commission, he has worked diligently to convince Congress to correct the funding imbalance in the federal gasoline tax distribution. His efforts, no doubt, had a decided impact on the recently adopted federal legislation;

WHEREAS, Mr. Limehouse received the state's highest civilian honor from Gov. Campbell in January 1995, and again in January 1998, from Gov. Beasley, when the Order of the Palmetto was presented for distinguished service;

**REQUEST FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR REVIEW OF
DRAFT OF SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION VERSION
OF THE STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS
FOR SEISMIC DESIGN FOR HIGHWAY BRIDGES**

The Department requests Commission approval to advertise for and select a consulting firm for the purpose of reviewing the prepared draft of SCDOT version of the Standard Specifications for Seismic Design of Highway Bridges. The Department has prepared this document and currently does not have the expertise to perform an independent review of the document in a manner sufficient for its publication as seismic specifications for statewide bridge projects. This document is necessary to provide adequate guidelines for seismic design and seismic retrofit to the Department's Bridge Design Section and consulting firms providing design services for the Department's bridge projects. The review is necessary to ensure that the draft contains accurate and up-to-date specifications for seismic design and retrofit.

The Department's cost versus the consultant's cost will be evaluated based on the scope of services. The evaluation will be used when negotiating services for the review. The Commission will be notified as to the scope and cost of this project.

**PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES
RIGHT OF WAY ACQUISITION SERVICES
SC ROUTE 146 IN GREENVILLE**

The Department requests Commission approval to advertise for and select a consulting firm or firms for the purpose of providing engineering and right of way acquisition services for the widening of SC Route 146 in Greenville. Based on the current and projected workload, the Department does not have sufficient staff to proceed with this project. The project will be funded from the federal program, more specifically from the GRATS guideshares.

Project description: This project involves the widening to five lanes of Woodruff Road from US 276 to Verdae Boulevard. The distance of the project is 1.7 miles.

Recommendations - 01/27/1999

"ON CALL" TREATED WOOD INSPECTION CONSULTANT

The South Carolina Department of Transportation requests Commission approval to advertise and select a consultant to provide treated wood inspection services on an "on call" basis. The contract will be for a period not to exceed three (3) years. Services will be provided for statewide projects. Costs for performing these services will not require a special appropriation of funds. Monies for the consultant services are set up for the various construction projects on which the material will be used.

"ON CALL" ENVIRONMENTAL CONSULTANT(S)

The South Carolina Department of Transportation requests Commission approval to advertise and select consultant(s) to provided environmental services on an "on call" basis. The contract will be for a period not to exceed three (3) years. Services will be provided for statewide projects.

The funding source will be both state and federal. The cost estimate for this work will be done on a project by project basis through negotiations with the selected consultant(s) with costs being provided to the Commission through the Executive Summary.

CONTRACT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES UNDERWATER BRIDGE INSPECTION

The Department proposed to use consultant engineering diving services to perform underwater bridge inspection on approximately 60 bridge sin various counties in District Nos. 2, 5 and 6. This will enable the Department to remain in compliance with the FHWA National Bridge Inspection Standards which require that bridges that meet certain criteria receive underwater inspections on a regular cycle not to exceed (5) five years.

It is recommended that the Commission give approval to advertise and select a consulting firm to perform this work.

**REQUEST FOR CONSULTANT TO PROVIDE
FOUNDATION TESTING SERVICES**

The Department requests Commission approval to advertise and select a consultant engineering firm to provide "on call" foundation testing services. The project will be for a maximum period of three (3) years. Funding for these services will be on a project by project basis and will be provided from various federal and state project funds.

**PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES
DESIGN SERVICES
SC ROUTE 24 IN ANDERSON**

The Department requests Commission approval to advertise for and select a consulting firm or firms for the purpose of providing design services for the widening of SC Route 24 in Anderson. Based on the current and projected workload, the Department does not have sufficient staff to proceed with this project. The project will be funded state State Infrastructure Bank funds.

Project Description: This project involves the widening to five lanes of SC Route 24 from SC Route 28 Bypass to SC Route 187. The length of the project is 6.8 miles.

**EXTENSION OF BITUMINOUS RESURFACING CONTRACTS
TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL RESURFACING WORK**

It is recommended that the Commission approve the action of the Department in extending existing bituminous retreatment contracts to include additional resurfacing work as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the Rev Dr Benjamin James "B.J." Gordon Jr., of West Andrews, in 1973 became the first African American from Williamsburg County since Reconstruction to be elected to the South Carolina House of Representatives, and served in the House until 1991;


WHEREAS during his tenure as Representative for Williamsburg County, he became a member of the Water Resources Commission, the Governor's Advisory Medicare Committee, the Rules Committee, the House Ways and Means Committee and the Committee on Hunger, and was recognized as one of the greatest orators in the House of Representatives;

WHEREAS Dr Gordon began a career in ministry at the age of 19, and at the time of his death in 1997, he was pastor of Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church (37 years), Piney Grove Missionary Baptist Church (34 years), and Wilson Chapel First Missionary Baptist Church, which he founded in 1974. Dr Gordon was the Moderator of the Williamsburg Missionary and Educational Baptist Association and Ministries.

WHEREAS Dr Gordon had a sincere desire to reach outside of his churches and bring about positive change in Williamsburg County and the State of South Carolina;

WHEREAS he was an educator as well as a minister, coaching and teaching at Lane Consolidated School and teaching at Eutawville Elementary School. He led the movement for equal hiring practices and employment at Oneita Knitting Mills and opened Gordon Developmental Center to ensure opportunities for individuals with special needs and disabilities, and served his community and state in many other ways.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the South Carolina Transportation Commission, in meeting duly assembled this 27th day of January 1999, upon the request of the Williamsburg County Legislative Delegation, that the portion of Highway 521 from its intersection with Highway 377 westerly to the Greeleyville city limits be named as the "Dr. Benjamin J. Gordon Jr. Memorial Highway" in recognition of his life of service

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
RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Intersection of U.S. 52 and S.C. 375 in Williamsburg County has traditionally been known as Gamble Crossroad

WHEREAS, in the year 1875 William G. Gamble purchased a 7,000-acre tract from his cousin Catherine Gamble Staggers. This land was bordered on the north by the Atlantic Coastline Railroad and on the south by the Santee River;

WHEREAS, in 1928, when U.S. 52 was paved, the crossing of the Old River Road, currently S.C. 375, became known as Gamble Crossroad;

RESOLUTION


WHEREAS, Herbert Gadson was elected Mayor of the Town of Hollywood in July 1989;
