

Columbia, S. C., February 29, 1944.

The State Budget Commission met in the Governor's Office at 4:00 o'clock on February 29, 1944. All members of the Commission were present.

The following appropriation transfers were authorized by the Commission:

State Board of Health

Printing & Advertising \$56.70 - To Special Payments  
Other Supplies \$113.30 - To Special Payments  
Printing & Advertising \$263.30 - To Travel

Commission on State House and Grounds

Water Heat Light & Power \$300.00 - To Supplies

State Treasurer's Office

Office Supplies \$80.00 - To Insurance - Premium on Bonds

State Tax Commission

From Alcoholic Liquors Revenue Acct \$500.00 - To a Special Fund for the Purchase of Articles which would constitute Evidence in the Enforcement of the Liquor Law

The following allotments were made from the Civil Contingent Fund:

James S. Wilson, Superintendent of the State Penitentiary, \$150.00 to Provide a \$25.00 monthly payment for six months to a former negro prisoner who was seriously injured while serving a term in the Penitentiary. This prisoner fell from an electric light pole when he came in contact with a live wire, and sustained serious injuries.

The following allotments were made from the Contingent Fund for

National Defense:

The United States Treasury \$4,750.64 to reimburse the Federal Government for expenditures for equipment purchased for the account of the Venereal Disease Control Program in South Carolina, which expenditures were later disallowed by Federal auditors.

To Christie Benet, State Chairman War Finance Committee of South Carolina \$750.00 to defray expenses of the Fourth War Loan in South Carolina.

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To Capt. John A. May \$300.00 to Reimburse Capt. May for expenses incurred in connection with his work as Liaison Officer attached to the Governor's Office.

The Commission concluded that it was without authority to contribute, or purchase advertising space, in the 1944 Finial, a publication sponsored by the students of the Columbia Bible College.

There being no further business, the Commission adjourned.

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
