#### Description/Significant Features:

Burbage Hunt Club is within the former location of the Wampee Plantation settlement (Site 38DR254). The hunt club is at the SW corner of Wampee Rd (Resource 1306.01) and Goldings Rd S (Resource 1306.02) in the central portion of site. The main lodge is a simple 1-story, wood frame building with a standing seam metal roof, weatherboard siding, and appears to sit on concrete blocks. The building has a flat roof with a very slight pitch towards the rear. A front porch extends the full width of the front elevation and extends to the south forming a portico. There are 2 hist. structures just north of lodge: a flat-roofed, screened shed and a gabled metal-roof open structure.

Alterations (include date(s), if known):

The building has at least one addition at the rear with unclad exterior walls. The metal roof covers these additions. The rear elevation includes non-historic sliding glass doors.

### **Historical Information**

Historical Information:

In the mid-twentieth century, buildings necessary to support timber and wildlife management were constructed on Watson Hill tract. Burbage Hunt Club organized in the 1940s and began leasing the Northern Parcel from Cooper River Timber Company, and later from West Virginia Pulp and Paper Company after 1944. The Burbage Hunt Club leased the land for more than 60 years and erected a lodge, sunk a well, and built dog cages at the Wampee Plantation (38DR254). They also divided up the old rice, cotton, corn, and phosphate fields for hunting deer, hogs, and other small game.
