MEMORANDUM

RE: Frederick Laron Summerset, S.C.D.P.P.P.S. Extradition

I am returning the application for extradition of Frederick Laron Summerset for the following reason(s):

1. _____ Paperwork is insufficient as follows:

Paragraph H of Request for Extradition Form needs to be corrected to reflect a conviction on the charge of Common Law Robbery.

Exemplification Copy of Records need the Clerk's raised seals affixed as indicated.

Fingerprint card and photograph by S.C.D.P.P.P.S. should be certified true copy or notarized as a true copy on file with the S.C.D.P.P.P.S.

A certified or notarized true copy of the S.C.D.P.P.P.S. form signed by the Probationer acknowledging the conditions of probation should be included in the package. Also, Florida **does recognize** our pre-signed waiver of extradition, which would eliminate the need for a formal request for extradition. In speaking with the Florida Authorities, it is my understanding that a pre-signed waiver was either not available or was not provided to them.

2. _____ Other:

According to Tammy Moylan, Warrants Division, Polk County, Florida, the subject was arrested on fugitive charges around July 22, 2004. He refused to waive extradition. The fugitive case was dismissed on September 21, 2004, after 60 days had passed. He was released from their custody on October 6, 2004, after service of sentence for local charges. Tammy Moylan stated that they do have an address for this subject.
