A judge today granted bail today for the former North Charleston officer who fatally shot Walter Scott. Judge Clifton Newman ruled that the trial delay was a change in circumstance that allowed him to reconsider bail. Newman also set the trial for Oct. 31. Attorneys for Slager, who is charged with murder in Scott's April 4 death, had filed a motion for a speedy trial and asked Newman to set the date in the spring.
