



Jill's House, a full-service overnight respite center, renews families through much-needed breaks while providing a safe, fun environment for children with special needs. This innovative 42,000-square foot, 45-bed respite resort for children ages 6 to 17 with intellectual disabilities and their siblings, is located in the Washington D.C. metropolitan area, providing rest to families of all faiths and backgrounds. Jill's House also serves families in Texas, California and Indiana through local partnerships. Since 2010, Jill's House has provided nearly 500,000 hours of rest and relief to 500 families. Receiving no direct state or federal funding, Jill's House was created and is maintained through individual donations and grants.
