Below are Dukes' updates from Kim. He sent them to the Governor directly.

Counties with help of EMD. Should get other updates throughout the morning from other counties.

Barnwell County: Last night, there were a couple of stations in the county without gas. One of those has gasoline this morning, so deliveries may have come during the night. Most other stations have gas, with no lines, and no price increase. A couple of stations have started increasing prices. First Responders are not expressing concerns at this point in time.

Aiken County: Yesterday afternoon, a couple of stations were out of gas, but plenty of other stations with gasoline and no lines or waits or price increases. No concerns in Aiken County.

No other counties reported any issues or any shortages/outages. No concerns in any of the remaining counties in Region 6 (Hampton, Allendale, Bamberg, Beaufort, Colleton, Jasper).

Richland: (Mike Kalec) He is not aware of any issue currently for Richland County.

Lexington: (Bo Davenport) He knows of no issues.

Calhoun: (David Chojnacki) He does not know of any issues at this time.

Kershaw: (Gene Faulkenberry) He does not know of any issues.

Newberry: (Tommy Long) He does not know of any problems.

Saluda: (Josh Morton) He does not have any issues currently. On Saturday the 7-11 in town did run out of gas, but they had a truck that evening that was able to re-fuel.

Fairfield- no response

Cherokee-Per Rick Peterson, he has observed no gas stations without gas, or lines. However, he has been fielding a number of questions from the public regarding future availability of gas. He foresees no problems supplying first responders at this time.

Chester-Per Eddie Murphy, he is unaware of any gas stations without gas, or lines. He is checking on first responders supply, however he doesn't believe that any problems exist at this time.

Lancaster-Per Darren Player, there are no shortages or lines, however the price of gasoline continues to rise. He foresees no problems with keeping first responders supplied.

Laurens-Per Joey Avery, there are no shortages or lines, however some stores, such as Ingles, are out. He foresees no problems with keeping first responders supplied.

Spartanburg-Per Doug Bryson, he is unaware of any shortages or lines. He foresees no problems, at this time.

Union-Per Rob Fraim, there are no shortages or lines at this time. He foresees no problems supplying first responders..

York-Per Mike Channell, several stations were out of gas on Saturday, with several more giving out today. Short lines, usually under 3 vehicles, have formed at times, however this hasn't caused a problem so far. York has its own gas and diesel pump, and he foresees no problems at this time with supplying first responders.
