South Carolina's coast plays a vital role in the protection of coastal birds. Due to erosion, their habitats are quickly vanishing. One of these critical habitats along the SC coast is Crab Bank Seabird Sanctuary. This crescent of sand, located near Shem Creek in the Charleston Harbor, once supported up to 5,000 birds in a single nesting season. This 2018 season, no birds will be able to nest there.

Here's how you can help:

- Donate Today to the SC Coastal Bird Conservation Program
- Put food scraps and fishing line in garbage cans, not on the beach
- Stay out of dunes. Not all nesting areas are marked
- Don't walk through flocks of birds or approach individual birds to make them fly
- Stay out of posted areas
- Follow beach rules about pets
- Learn to identify and appreciate birds
