- WHEREAS,** ovarian cancer is a gynecologic cancer that starts in a woman's ovaries; and
- WHEREAS,** if found and treated early at a localized stage, the five year relative survival rate is approximately 94 percent; and
- WHEREAS,** it is estimated that more than 21,000 American women will be diagnosed with ovarian cancer this year; and
- WHEREAS,** research continues in an effort to identify risk factors and causes, effective screening and prevention techniques, early detection, accurate diagnosis, and new approaches to treatment in an effort to achieve more positive patient outcomes and enhance the health and well-being of all South Carolinians; and
- WHEREAS,** Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month provides an opportunity to celebrate survivors of ovarian cancer, remember those lost to the disease, and call attention to the need for continued research.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim September 2015 as

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to work together to increase awareness of ovarian cancer and promote continued research into the disease.
