

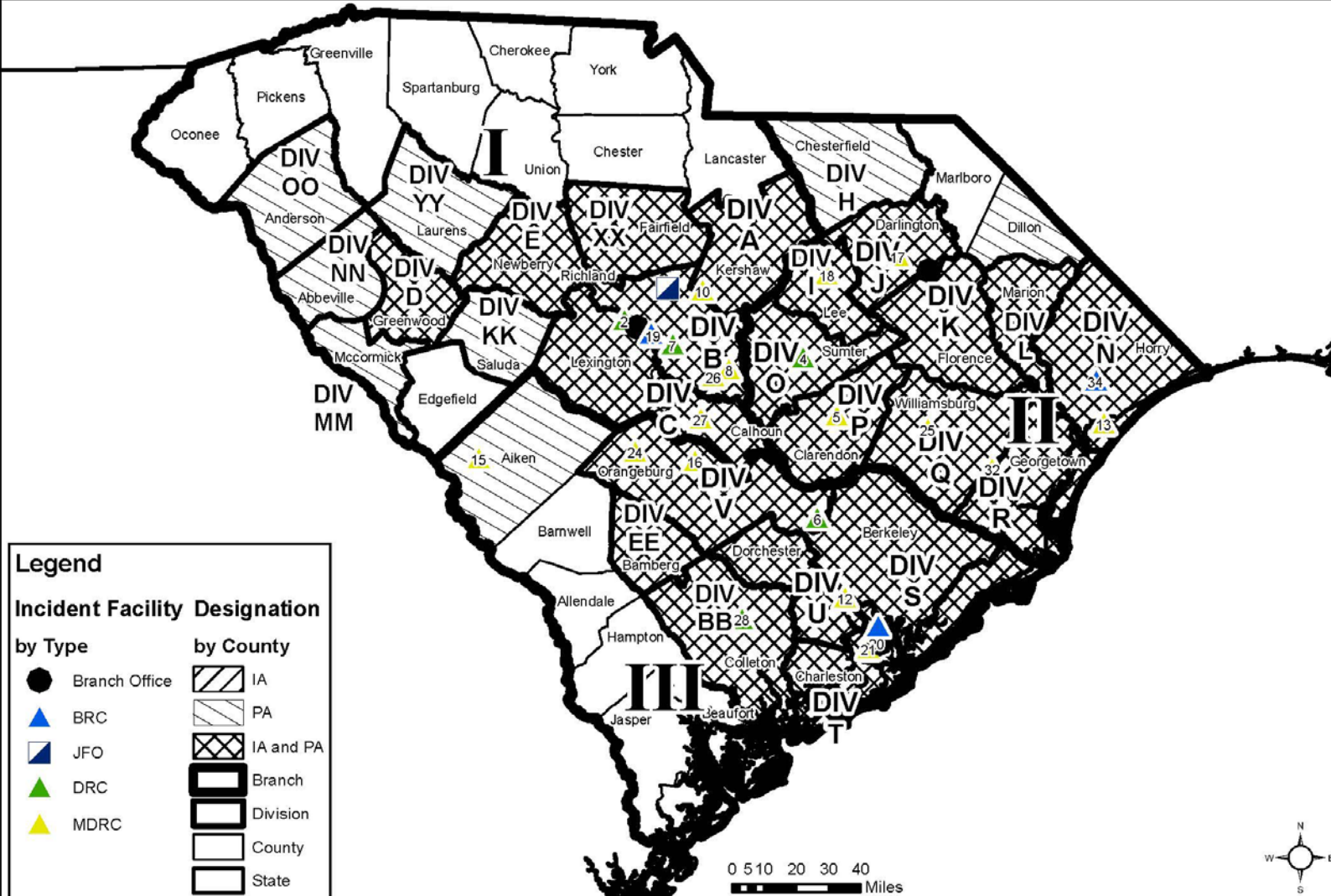

### Overview of Hazards

**Current Weather:** Rain. High near 58. Northeast wind around 13 mph. Chance of precipitation is 100%. New precipitation amounts between a quarter and half of an inch possible.

#### NWS Warnings:

- Coastal Flood Warnings in effect **Beaufort; Charleston; Coastal Colleton & Tidal Berkeley counties**
- Coastal Flood Advisory in effect until 1000 EDT for Coastal Georgetown & Horry counties

### Situation Overview

- Designated counties: **34** (34 PA, 22 IA)
- On 10/26/2015 the counties of Lancaster, Beaufort, Marlboro & Allendale were declared for Public Assistance
- FRN #9 officially ended the Incident period on 10/23/2015
- 19 fatalities (8 traffic, 11 drowning)
- Incident: 10/01/2015 – **10/23/2015**

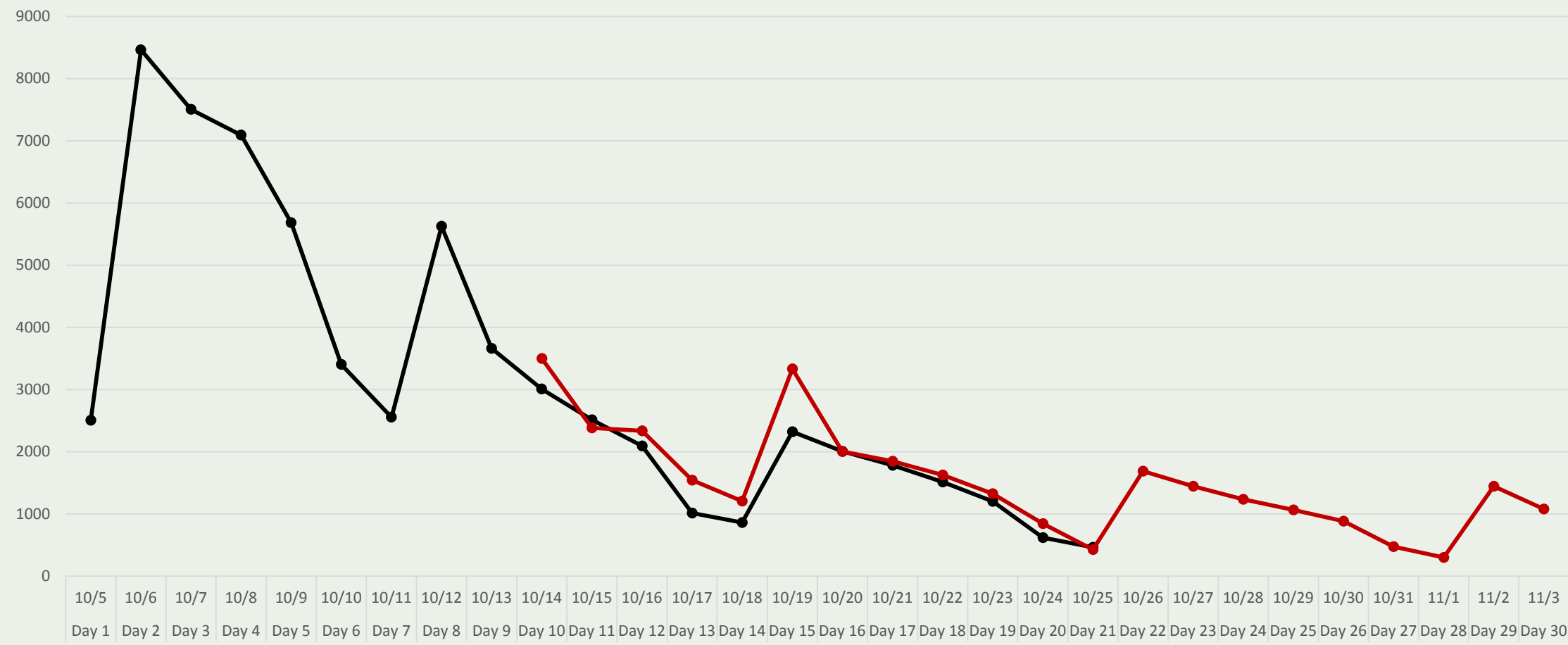

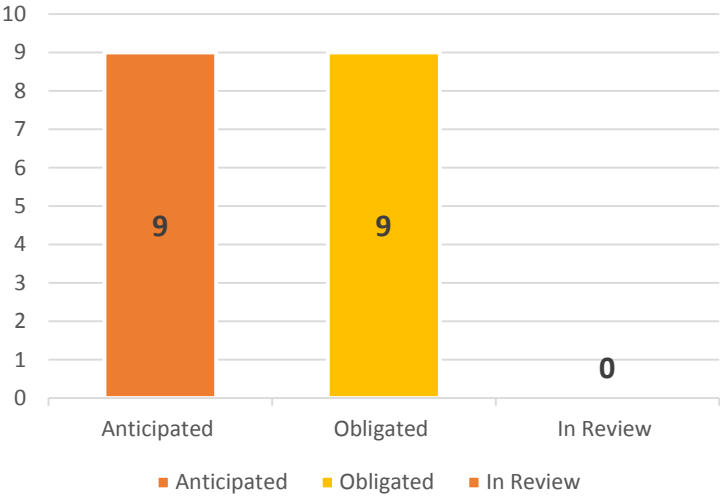

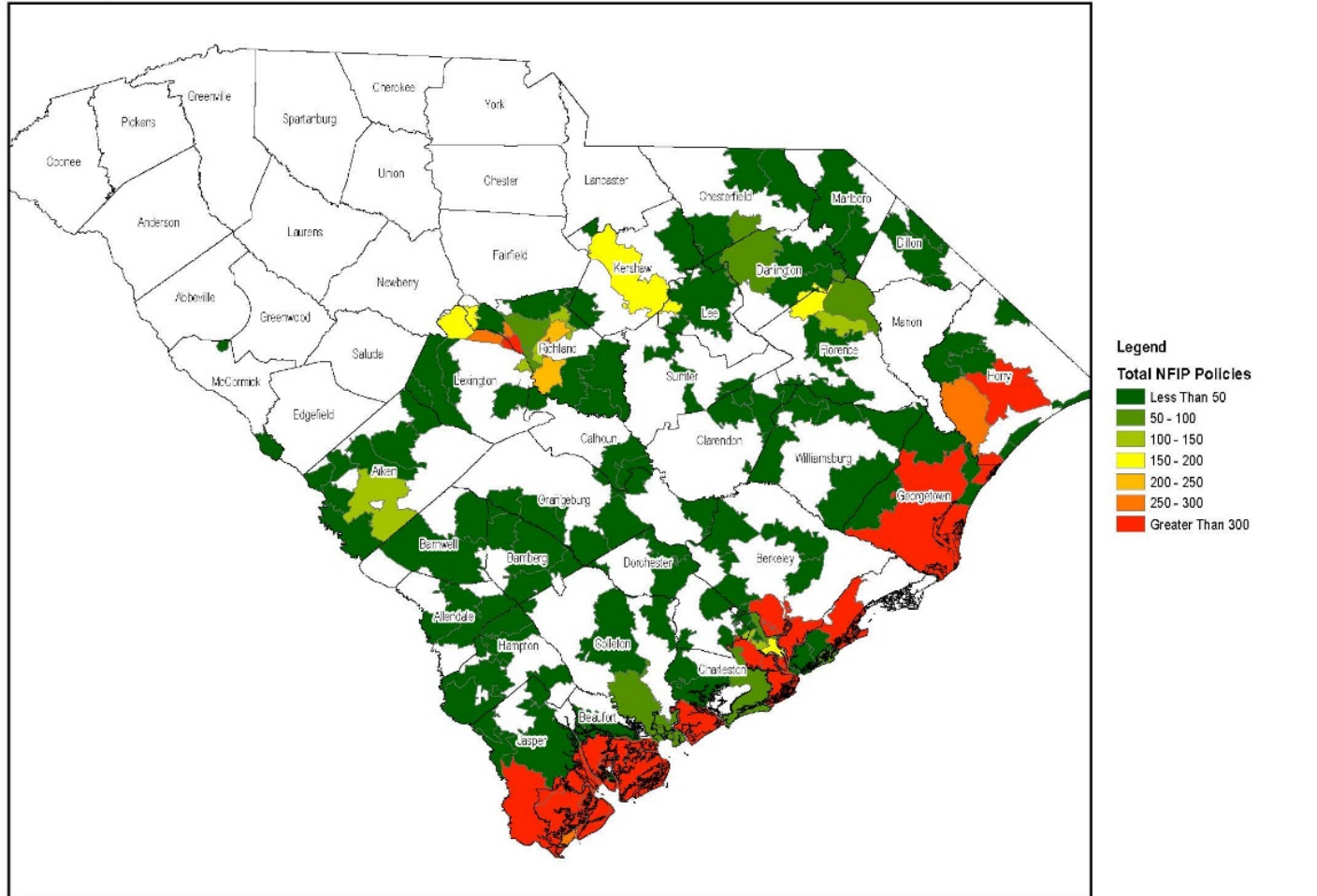

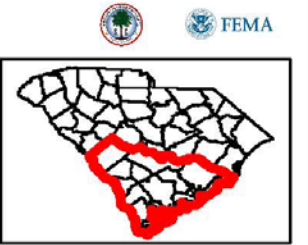

## Emergent Issues: Roads and Bridges

### Richland County:

- 44 roads are damaged. Of these 44 roads, 13 will be opened by October 31st, 11 by November 26th, and 20 after November 26<sup>th</sup>

### Lexington County

- 11 roads are reported damaged. Out of the 11 roads, 4 will be open by October 31st, 2 will be open by November 26th, and 5 will be open after November 26<sup>th</sup>

### Georgetown County

- 3 State, 2 washouts. Pennyroyal Rd. closed until after 11-26-15. All roads to Big Dam Swamp open, Pine Tree Landing closed Repairs to S-52, S-20, by 10/31 and S-42, S-36 after 11/26
- Effective today road closure numbers reflect only those roads impacted by the flood

### Sumter County:

- state roads are closed. 6 roads are washed out. Bridge replacement needed on S-44. Structure damaged on S-37
- The Cains Millpond Dam (D1578), Lake View Pond Dam (D1917), and Ellerbees Mill Pond Dam (D1460) breached. There is no threat to public safety. Road repair plan is in effect
- Effective today, road closure numbers reflect roads impacted by the flooding only
