Ms. Veldran,
Thank you for taking these questions for us.

As a “non-profit” a church does not pay income taxes, however we do submit Federal and State Income tax information quarterly through a 941 and yearly on a W-2 to employees. (Some ministers elect to not withhold through the employer (the church) because they are “self-employed for Social security reasons.)

Our questions: 1. Are non-profits/ churches included in the “businesses” that were possible victims of the Cyber Attack?

2. Will the use of 941 filings and W-2 state filings also cause Churches to be included in the “business” concerns and require the churches to call for the credit monitoring/ identity protection?

3. Are church EIN numbers being compromised because they appear on the 941 and W-2 forms issued?

4. Should churches be concerned about contacting all former staff/employees who now live out of state and provide the information for personal identification protection?

We are addressing this information in a press release to our 2135 churches through several media streams today if possible.
