

Ms. Willis took my insurance checks, cashed them and kept the money for numerous policies. She did these harmful acts while being on probation with the State of South Carolina. She even cashed checks for her personal church where she wrote bogus policies. Can you imagine? I wish myself and others had been aware of her probationary status.

I along with numerous others are victims of a heinous, greedy white collar crime. This financial disaster has caused me to sell my home in Edisto and buy a less expensive home in Abbeville. I would welcome the opportunity to discuss this with you and your staff. Many of us have retained legal representation with the Hite and Stone Law Firm. Our Attorney General office appears to be slow in the prosecution of Ms. Willis. Four years is a long time for victims to wait for justice help from our state. How can you help us? I was promised over 2 years ago that I would be "in court" soon by the State of SC.
