Morning,

I know you guys have been hounded about the flag and code 1-10-10 for the past few days, but the network is looking for a final answer on this so I promise this is the last time I'll ask. I spoke this AM with spokesman Brian Gaines in the Budget and Control Board office. He explained to me that when the office takes down the flag for any reason, it must be replaced by another one (obviously). When I asked him if the flag could be taken down and not replaced for an hour or 2 and if that would violate the code, he said he did not know. I asked if anyone else in their office knew and he said there was not anyone else who could answer. I asked him if Gov McNair's actions years back violated the code, he said he was not familiar with the incident and could not comment.

The final question for your office is, Would the governor use this unknown factor (since it appears that the Budget and Control Board does not have a finite time period for the replacement) to remove the flag at any period in the next few days (in light of tomorrow's funeral) or weeks until the legislature can vote on it? Is she reconsidering at all or is it a flat no?
