I have done a fair amount of messing around and I think that we're at a reasonable place with how to put tables in so they're the width of the header/footer and so that the recommendations match the changes.

1. Your change solar amounts are set for '20' wide, or 145 pixels. We need to bring this down to 19.43, or 142 pixels.
2. When we bring the object in, we need to set the aspect ratio at 43% height, 47% wide and 'unlock' the ratio so we can make the 'changes' table 7.86". For some reason it's natural tendency is to come out at 7.8", even when the total widths of the columns of both tables are the same. I don't know why, and have messed with column widths and aspect ratios. This appears to work the best.
3. Excel objects unfortunately still work the best, so I am afraid the document may be huge again. If I get acrobat to a printable resolution, we lose our data gains. Just bringing in the table requires too much reformatting.

I put in a few legislative agencies using your current column sizes and the standard aspect ratio, and then did the ALC with the proposed fix. If you're fine with what I did in the ALC, I'll start doing more so we can work on configuration.

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
