M I N U T E S

Mr. Poore called the meeting to order and Councilman Fred H. Bratcher gave the invocation.

On the motion of Mr. Kinley, seconded by Mr. Hooper, Council voted unanimously to approve the minutes from the July 7, 1981 meeting as mailed.

Mr. Robert P. Lusk presented Council with Resolution #126 and Assistance Agreement for West Point Pepperell-Wellington Mill for Industrial Revenue Bonds. On the motion of Mr. Hooper, seconded by Mr. Kinley, Council voted unanimously to approve the Resolution.

Mr. Poore discussed a letter from S.C. Department of Health & Environmental Control requesting that Bill's Landing, Muldrow Park and Paul's Landing be formally closed at Broadway Lake to the public swimming until adequate facilities and services are restored. Mr. Carlisle Thompson spoke briefly recommending that we keep the parks open and work up a method to keep the parks in good condition with a patrolman and helper. Mr. Poore advised Mr. Mac Walters to contact DHEC and inform them that the parks will be cleaned and all needed corrections will be made as soon as possible. Council received as information.

Mr. Rudolph Cole, chairman of the Anderson County Solid Waste Authority, explained the agreement Council made in January, 1981 with the Authority regarding the purchase of equipment with a 50-50 grant through Appalachia. The equipment has arrived and they requested the County's portion. Mr. Poore advised that they could expect the check August 1, 1981. Mr. Cole also explained a deficit of \$53,927 that the County Solid Waste was involved with. Mr. Poore advised Mr. Kinley and Mr. Watson to meet with the County Treasurer first thing Wednesday, July 22, 1981, to come up with a solution to the problem.

Mr. David Watson presented a request to purchase three mobile radios and sirens for the Sheriff's office. The Sheriff had requested Motorola to be compatible with the existing equipment. On the motion of Mr. Bratcher, seconded by Mr. Hooper, Council voted unanimously to allow the purchase.

Mr. David Hooper presented first reading on Ordinance #68 (Sewer System or Systems). On the motion of Mr. Hooper, seconded by Mr. Rhodes, Council voted unanimously to adopt on first reading.

Mr. Jeffcoat asked Council to consider repairing the roads in Pineforest and Camelot subdivisions. Mr. Poore advised Mr. Jeffcoat that the County Engineer would try to get out there this week.

On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Wright, Council voted unanimously to transfer the \$10,000 appropriated for the Detoxification Center into Code 910 - Contingency Fund in the 1981-82 FY Budget.

Mr. Kinley approached Council with the question why delinquent taxes amounting to over \$3.5 Million have gone uncollected from 1972-1979. Mr. Poore asked Mr. Rhodes, Mr. Kinley, and Mr. Hooper to get with the County Treasurer and find out what the problem is.

On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Wright, Council voted unanimously to adjourn at 9:00 p.m.
