122nd Reorganization

The 122nd General Assembly met to reorganize two weeks ago. I was fortunate to remain on the Education & Public Works Committee, appointed subcommittee chairman for Ad Hoc Committee on Competency Based Education and Education Reform, and appointed to the Legislative Oversight Committee.

So, for the next two years, my official legislative duties include:

Pre-filed Bills

Over 550 bills were pre-filed. I pre-filed 8 bills. I more thoroughly explained all on my [website](#) but below is a list:

- H3004, reduces time period for a mortgage holder to respond to satisfaction requests from 3 months to 30 days.
- H3005, updates smoke detector legislation for landlord/tenants.
- H3031, a business-friendly bill that defines the role of a franchisor to push back against the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB).
- H3242, expands those able to sign for a minor at the DMV to apply for a beginner's permit or driver's license.
- H3243, updated Fargo's and Hyco's Law, that intentionally killing a law enforcement animal should carry mandatory jail time and restitution.
- H3322, recognition that foster children need a driver's license to become independent.
- H3316, creates a mileage-based user fee

Table Rock State Park Forest Fire

On November 9, an unintended campfire created a forest fire in Table Rock State Park, which lasted four weeks until full containment, impacted 11,000 acres of land, involved over 300 personnel on-site, and cost nearly \$5 million. Those are the statistics, the story is much more interesting (op-ed hopefully published soon).

Most important, there was no loss of life or injury sustained in four weeks of firefighting. Second, there was no loss of structure.

To the hundreds of fighters from multiple states, the dozens of SC Forestry from other counties, Table Rock Retreat Center, SC National Guard, Red Cross, first responders, the volunteers who fed the organization and to those in the community who donated, speaking for the State of South Carolina and community of Pickens County, we thank you.
