**MOX Project, Veterans, and Clean Up Continues -- Update from Sen. Tom Young

SRS -- Latest as to MOX Decision

What is the Issue? : Last Tuesday, President Obama released his 2015 budget proposal which freezes funding for the MOX project at SRS. DOE officials said that the proposal places the MOX project into a "cold stand-by." The Mixed Oxide (MOX) Fuel Fabrication Facility is designed to turn weapons-grade plutonium into nuclear reactor fuel. That is part of a nonproliferation agreement between the United States and Russia to dispose of weapons-grade plutonium.

What this Means – Local and Regional Impact : As of today, officials are still trying to determine the extent of the local impact because no official word has been released to the contractors associated with MOX. A shutdown could mean the loss of up to 1,600 jobs at SRS. The negative impact of such job losses on the Central Savannah River Area would be very significant. Also, 13 metric tons of plutonium, intended to be disposed of through the MOX facility, are stored at SRS. As of late last week, DOE officials could not provide specifics on a plan to dispose of these materials in the absence of an operational MOX facility.

What this Means – National Impact : The MOX facility was being built as a part of an international agreement with Russia to dispose of weapons grade plutonium. The failure to proceed with the MOX facility leaves open questions as to (1) how will the federal government honor the United States' end of the agreement with Russia and (2) what will the cost of other alternatives be when compared to the price tag of

finishing the MOX project? Further, suppliers to the project are located in more than 35 states so any shutdown will have an impact beyond our region and state.

Local Response : Our County legislative delegation is meeting with Congressman Wilson, the Governor's staff, officials from the Department of Commerce, and officials from the Department of Health and Environmental Control later this week. Additionally, Senators Graham and Scott, joined by other U.S. Senators, wrote a letter last week to the Department of Energy seeking a reversal of the decision.

Long Term Vision Needed : This latest decision as to MOX underscores the need for the following: (1) new and clearly defined missions for SRS beyond clean up; (2) new efforts to harness the SRS National Lab as a catalyst for private entrepreneurship and private economic investment in our region similar to efforts undertaken at the national lab in Oak Ridge, Tennessee; (3) continued emphasis by local and state officials to make Aiken County attractive to new economic investment and to expansion by existing companies in our region; and (4) a clear path forward for the disposition of weapons grade plutonium stored at SRS. Your legislative delegation is committed to working together on these issues for the long term benefit of our community, region, and state.

Last Week in the Senate

Missed School Days : Last week, the House of Representatives concurred with the Senate version of this legislation requiring school districts to use any remaining make-up days on the calendar and then the districts would be allowed to forgive up to 5 missed days. After the make up days are used, then the district's governing body has the discretion to excuse up to five missed days due to the bad weather problems.

Texting and Driving : Last week, the full Senate voted in favor of legislation that would ban beginning drivers - those with a permit or restricted license – from using cell phones at all. I voted in favor. There is opposition to another bill that would prohibit all drivers from texting while driving. I support that legislation.

South Carolina and the Affordable Care Act : Last week, the Senate started debating legislation related to the Affordable Care Act (a/k/a Obamacare) in South Carolina. A special committee held several meetings last Fall around the state as it explored constitutional ways to minimize the impact of the federal law on South Carolina. The committee's amendment is up for consideration. I expect the debate to be lengthy.

Veteran Information Update

Medal of Honor : Last Thursday, we learned that Kyle Carpenter from Lexington County will be South Carolina's first Medal of Honor recipient since the Vietnam War.

Veterans and College Tuition Rates : The Senate Education Committee will consider two bills this week related to veterans and their dependents attending college in South Carolina. The legislation would allow veterans and their dependents to pay in-state college tuition rather than be treated as out-of-state students paying higher tuition rates. More than 20 other states have already implemented similar measures.
