SUBJECT: Phone Call with Senate Finance Committee Staff

On July 14, Enforcement and Compliance (E&C) staff spoke by telephone with Elissa Alben, International Trade Counsel to the Senator Wyden, Ranking Member of the Senate Finance Committee, at her request. Ms. Alben was seeking background and an update on the status of the countervailing duty (CVD) investigation of imports of supercalendered paper from Canada. E&C discussed the progress and the status of the investigation. Ms. Alben asked about the investigation of the allegations that the Province of Nova Scotia is providing both stumpage (the right to harvest standing timber) and electricity at prices that are less than adequate remuneration. E&C staff explained the nature of these allegations.
