Supreme Court Ruling Returns Church-State Cases to States

The U.S. Supreme Court sent two Blaine Amendment cases back to the states in light of their *Trinity Lutheran* decision, where the high court ruled that excluding a religious preschool from participating in a state-funded playground resurfacing program was unconstitutional.

Trinity Lutheran could influence state court decisions nationwide on religious private school funding, including vouchers.
