

Thank you for your letter of February 7, 2008 in which you expressed interest in serving as a Commissioner on the State Ethics Commission. I believe that your background and your obvious interest would make you a likely candidate for appointment; however, at this time there are no open seats.

The Commission is made up of nine members, one from each of the six Congressional Districts and three At-Large. Members are appointed by the Governor, confirmed by the General Assembly, and serve five year terms. The Commission's jurisdiction extends to all public officials, public employees and public members at all levels of state and local government with the exception of the Legislature and the Judiciary.

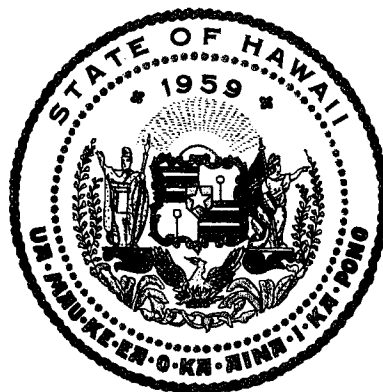
The term of the Commissioner in the 2nd Congressional District, which includes Hilton Head, expires May 31, 2010. Two of the At-Large seats expire June 30, 2010 and the third expires June 30, 2011.
