The Herald-Journal received a press release from an organization called Reform Sex Offender Laws, Inc. This group says it has asked Gov. Haley to use her executive powers to remove registrants' street addresses from public view until the Legislature can consider a more comprehensive remedy.

This request is in response to the recent killings of Charles and Gretchen Parker in Union County. One of the accused murderers, Jeremy Moody, told investigators he targeted Charles Parker because Parker was a registered sex offender and Moody claimed he wrote down another sex offender's name he planned to kill on Wednesday.

Rob, does Gov. Haley plan to take any action or reexamine the way the state currently makes information on registered sex offenders available? Does her office have any comment in regards to this organization's request? Please let me know if you want me to forward you the press release. Thanks for your assistance.
