Subject: Latest Cruise Discounts from Vacations To Go plus Alan Fox Reports on Regent's New Seven Seas Explorer

Dear Mr. Kester,

Last month, on a warm and cloudless night in the harbor of Monte Carlo, **Regent Seven Seas Cruises'** new ship, **Seven Seas Explorer**, was christened by her godmother, Princess Charlene of Monaco. The ceremony was followed by a performance by renowned Italian tenor Andrea Bocelli, the most successful classical solo artist of all time.

The next day, the ship set sail on a pre-inaugural cruise that visited glamorous ports in Italy, Spain and France. Alan Fox was on board and his report is below.

I've just returned from Monte Carlo and the christening and pre-inaugural sailing of **Regent Seven Seas Cruises'** first new ship in 13 years, **Seven Seas Explorer**. I could not turn down an invitation to see what Regent is calling "the most luxurious ship ever built."

A claim like that sets expectations pretty darn high, but I'm here to report that the stunning Seven Seas Explorer does not disappoint. From the moment you step on board, you will find opulence and extravagance at every turn.

With a price tag of more than \$450 million, the highest price ever for a luxury ship, Seven Seas Explorer boasts nearly 2,500 pieces of artwork, including two original Picassos, and one of the highest space-per-passenger ratios in industry history.

The ship features 473 crystal chandeliers, including several large and exquisitely designed masterpieces in restaurants and public areas that are as much artwork as lighting.

Holding a mere 750 passengers, the all-suite, all-balcony accommodations are elegantly decorated and exceedingly comfortable and include the largest balconies at sea.

The best of the best?

The \$10,000-a-night Regent Suite, largest suite on the ship at 4,443 square feet. There you will find two spacious bedrooms and balconies, an in-suite spa including sauna and steam room, two and a half marble-and-stone bathrooms, an outdoor Jacuzzi, a Steinway Arabesque piano by high-end furniture designer Dakota Jackson and a \$150,000 Savoir No. 1 bed with eiderdown duvet.

It must take a lot of willpower just to leave the room in the morning.

If the Regent Suite is out of the question but you're still determined to sail on the most luxurious ship ever built, a quick scan of all scheduled sailings reveals starting rates of \$421 to \$837 per person, per night, depending on the destination and which suite categories are still available.

To put those prices in perspective, keep in mind that Regent is one of only four six-star cruise lines and the most all-inclusive of them all. Here's some of what the upfront price on a Regent cruise covers:

- Unlimited shore excursions
- Unlimited beverages including fine wines and premium spirits
- Prepaid gratuities
- Meals at specialty restaurants

- Unlimited WiFi
- Fitness programs, sauna and steam rooms in the spa
- Onboard activities including expert guest lectures, theater performances and daytime entertainment
- Butler service in Penthouse Suites and higher, included iPad in suite and iPod docking station
- In-suite mini-bar replenished daily
- 24-hour room service, with dinners served course-by-course during restaurant hours

People booking a similar-size suite on a lower-rated ship may find that their total bill is equal to, or higher than, the Regent rate when the cost of all these "extras" has been added.

For most cruise lovers, food is all-important and Seven Seas Explorer's dining options are varied and tantalizing.

Compass Rose is Regent's signature dining room, featuring the finest in contemporary cuisine, Versace place settings and a breathtaking blue chandelier. Local specialties that change with the cruise destination are served alongside health-conscious options and vegetarian dishes.

Sette Mari at La Veranda offers a casual, indoor-and-outdoor dining experience with an extensive menu of Italian delicacies.

In addition, the vessel has three gourmet specialty restaurants.

Pacific Rim offers a wide array of raw and cooked delicacies celebrating the culinary traditions of Asia.

Chartreuse is a classic French restaurant with a modern twist.

Prime 7 is an elegant steakhouse with meat and seafood specialties.

If no expense has been spared in the creation of Seven Seas Explorer, none is spared in her operation, with one officer or crew member for every 1.36 passengers. That amazing ratio enables the kind of pampering and individualized attention one might hope for on a six-star vessel. I found friendly and efficient officers and crew at every turn.

Jason Montague, the president and COO of Regent Seven Seas Cruises, calls Seven Seas Explorer the "next evolution of the Regent experience," and it is indeed that. The line's other ships are evolving too, and by early 2017, the company will have spent \$125 million to update every suite and many common areas on the Navigator, Voyager and Mariner.

In 2020, a sister ship to Seven Seas Explorer will be launched; details on that vessel are still to come.

I've always believed that a cruise ship delivers a better overall vacation value than any land-based option, in every price or quality category. To win that competition in the luxury segment, a ship must offer accommodations and service that match or exceed that of the best hotels and resorts, and dining options equal to the best gourmet restaurants on land. Seven Seas Explorer does just that, while delivering quality entertainment and educational experiences, the excitement of being at sea and the ease and wonder of having a new city or island or country pull up to your door every morning.

Is Seven Seas Explorer the most luxurious ship in the world? She has my vote.
