Depending on who you ask, the birthplace of barbecue is in South Carolina (really)! On what is now Parris Island, where marines are “born,” the Spanish and Native Americans gathered together and combined resources. The locals had the pit cooking competence, while the newcomers had the pigs. It was, in some ways, a food marriage made in heaven.

Now, about five centuries later, South Carolina has opened its doors and its heart to every imaginable preparation of what we call barbecue. In fact, one of the BBQ claims to fame in these parts is the presence of the four different sauces – vinegar and pepper, mustard, light tomato and heavy tomato-based sauce. Some restaurants, in the spirit of inclusiveness, offer all of the sauces in their repertoire, enabling a culinary tour of the good stuff, so to speak.

For it is the sauce that makes the difference around here. And although there are many mighty fine concoctions with chicken, beef and even seafood, at the heart and history of the matter is the mighty pig.

Some barbecue trails include qualifiers, guidelines, requirements and more. Here, the good folks at South Carolina Tourism have thrown it all on the table, allowing you to choose from more than 200+ establishments, depending on your preferences and location when BBQ hunger strikes. The options, my friends, are almost endless. Do your homework and plan to visit one of these porcine palaces when you can. But first, learn more at the [official website](#). You'll be armed with everything you need to make tummy-pleasing choices for you and yours.

WOW Factor: the sheer amount of research that's gone into sharing information on the SC Barbecue Trail. There are maps, history lessons, more about sauces, the festivals, cook-offs, competitions, cookbooks, associations, and side dishes, desserts and ubiquitous sweet tea. More than you want to know? Not really. Everything you need to arm yourself in the hunt for the perfect purveyor of barbecue.

Hint: Do your homework. Go with an empty stomach. Know what you are eating. Some barbecue hash includes pork liver which many – but not all – folks enjoy. My spouse is not a fan. It would ruin the most delightful barbecue dinner for him. And finally, ask if the cook is a pit master (there's even a school for it in Charleston). For many, pit-cooked barbecue is a skill that's been passed down for generations. And when you find it, you'll understand why the South Carolina Barbecue Trail is a gift for us all. Amazing Depth through Illusion and Talent

Christian Thee – artist, theatre set designer, magician, children's book author and illustrator. The Columbia, South Carolina native and University of South Carolina graduate is a remarkable talent and leading light of the arts and culture scene in the state capital.

Although he caught a bit of the acting and set design bug at Town Theatre during his teen years, it was in New York that he honed his talents as a stage designer and scenic artist. At Columbia University, he studied with Lester Polakov and later, was hired as assistant to the legendary stage designer Jo Mielziner. His experience there included work on more than 27 Broadway shows, including Carousel, South Pacific, Guys and Dolls, and A Streetcar Named Desire, as well as working as lead designer for the New York Metropolitan Opera.

During his career, he developed an extraordinary love of magic, and from there, evolved into a superb magician as well as a remarkable *trompe l'oeil* artist. For Christian Thee, Seeing is not necessarily Believing.

His client list includes names like Donald Trump and David Koch, Joan Rivers, and the United Kingdom's Prince Andrew. His work is displayed in countless homes and offices. Today, he maintains a lovely lakeside home in Columbia. In the Carolinas he may be best known for his design of the poster for the premiere *Spoletto Festival USA*, held in Charleston in 1977 and annually since then.

His remarkable art is often enhanced by three-dimensional embellishments and his work has been the subject of many articles.

He's also a published author. His critically-acclaimed children's book, *Behind the Curtain*, introduces young readers to the magic of theater, and is available on Amazon.

As his biography states, "Christian Thee continues to paint, innovate, invent and entertain at his lakeside home in Columbia, South Carolina. His home features marvelous paintings, *trompe l'oeil* designs, and a working studio that astound thousands of visitors every year."

Billy Graham Evangelist to the World

He just turned 96 and although his hearing and eyesight are failing, friends report that his mind remains sharp and his heart is still loving.

William Graham was born November 7, 1918, and grew up on a dairy farm near Charlotte, NC. He is one of the most famous people in the world and has counseled presidents and politicians, entertainers and artists.

For many of us raised in the South, a Billy Graham crusade was must-watch television, even if our families did not always agree with everything he said. He was universally respected for his sincerity and his beliefs, as well as his honorable approach to life.

Many believe he was an important catalyst in the Civil Rights Movement. In 1953, at one of his crusades, Mr. Graham tore down ropes that had been placed to separate the audience into racial sections. It is said that he told a white audience this: "We have been proud and thought we were better than any other race, any other people. Ladies and gentlemen. We are going to stumble into hell because of our pride."

He backed up his words by allowing African-American ministers to serve as members of his New York crusade's executive committee.

He became close friends with the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. (although the two had significant differences, especially over the Vietnam War, at certain times during their decade-long friendship.) In 1963, Mr. Graham posted bail for Dr. King to be released from jail during civil rights protests in Birmingham.

Mr. Graham refused to preach in segregated churches, and refused to visit South Africa until its government allowed integrated seating for audiences.
