

December 16, 1941.

The Budget Commission met in the office of Senator Maybank, at Washington, D. C., on December 16 at 10:00 o'clock A. M. All members of the Commission were present except Governor Harley, who was represented by Mr. John K. Cauthen.

The Commission discussed at length with Senator Maybank the policies which had been agreed upon as governing their recommendations to the General Assembly. Of particular interest in the discussion was the matter of the Commission's recommendation in connection with the Department of Public Welfare, the matter of a contingent fund on National Defense, and the necessity for buildings at certain institutions which would promote or which concerned National Defense.

After considerable discussion the Commission recessed to meet again the next day, December 17.

December 17, 1941.

The Commission met in the office of Senator Maybank and resumed its discussion of the subjects dealt with on the previous day. Full agreement was reached on all matters discussed as to the recommendations of the Commission, and will be shown in the budget report for the fiscal year 1942-43.

The Commission then adjourned.
