The two slave cabins preserved at Redcliffe Plantation State Historic Site represent a small and increasingly vanishing number of slave cabins preserved and open to the public in the United States. Built in 1857, shortly before the Civil War, Redcliffe's two cabins are small, two-room structures meant for two families or 20 people to live in. Many slave cabins have been torn down over the years because they fell into disuse or were thought unimportant compared to plantation mansions. Visit the cabins at Redcliffe today and show your support for the preservation of these important historic buildings.
