Dear Director:

My mother, Juanita A. Butler, a client of Logisticare Solutions, LLC (LogisticCare), has informed me that her transportation drivers have requested her to secure restraint belts for wheelchair clients, and to reach behind her, while she was seated in the front seat, to close the van door. Ms. Butler has also informed me that unstable and ill clients frequently have difficulty entering and exiting the van, and that she often assists those patients out of concern for their safety. According to Ms. Butler, the driver's frequently advise her that it is "not their responsibility" to do so. While it may be the policy of Logisticare that drivers are not responsible for basic safety of clients, I assure you that it is not Ms. Butler's responsibility. Therefore:

- 1) Ms. Butler absolutely will not secure restraint belts for clients in wheelchairs, during transportation.
- 2) Ms. Butler absolutely will not reach behind her to pull the van door closed. That is not Ms. Butler's responsibility and could cause her physical injury.
- 3) Ms. Butler absolutely will not assist the driver whatsoever in providing "reasonably" basic safety for clients.

In view of the foregoing, it is suggested that Logisticare review it's guidelines and train it's drivers accordingly. Failure to do so could have litigious consequences.



Thank you for your letter to our agency Director regarding safety issues raised by your mother, Ms. Juanita Butler, concerning Logisticare's transportation providers. We have shared your letter with Logisticare and they have assured the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) that this matter will be appropriately addressed.

You are absolutely correct that there are specific safety guidelines and procedures for which Logisticare's transportation drivers must adhere. We have advised Logisticare to review these guidelines and policies and procedures with their providers to make certain their drivers understand that compliance with such policies is required. We have also reminded Logisticare of the consequences for non-compliance.

Please know that the safety and well being of Ms. Butler and all of our Medicaid beneficiaries is of the utmost concern to us. If you have any other concerns regarding Medicaid transportation, please do not hesitate contact us.
