Here are two links that better explain the passport cards.

They are NOT valid for international travel by AIR. Rather, they are intended for border state residents who frequently drive/bus/sail to Mexico or Canada or for cruises to the Caribbean.

They are valid forms of ID for US DOMESTIC travel as they are GOVERNMENT ISSUED forms of ID- and that is the requirement (Driver's license, military ID or government issued photo ID, etc). Though, since they are new and not yet in use, I would not be surprised if during the initial roll-out TSA agents are unfamiliar with them. I would still carry a driver's license in the beginning.
