

Tidbit TUESDAY! July 1, 1936 marked the first South Carolina State Park to open to the public. It cost \$728.13 to run Myrtle Beach State Park that first year! This aerial photo showcases some early facilities that were built by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC). The bath house and boardwalk were the heart and soul of the park for many years. The boardwalk was destroyed in 1954 by Hurricane Hazel, and the bath house was dismantled in 1967 and is now the apartments. Today, the shelter has been moved closer to the beach. Come see for yourself all the other changes Myrtle Beach State Park has undergone through the years!
